THE NEATHAMMER STORY

Jacob Neathammer was born Dec. 2, 1811 in Germany, he married Sarah Jane M oore, who was born in Virginia on May 14, 1822, in January 11, 1840. Jacob died N ov. 29, 1898 and Sarah passed away April 18, 1894. They are buried at Rock Point Cemetery near Gold Hill, Oregon.

Jacob and Sarah had six children during the time they lived in Cole County, Missouri. George was born Jan. 11, 1841 but was killed on Oct. 1, 1854 at the age of 14 yrs, 3 mos. Their first daughter, Mary Ann was born Dec. 14, 1842, married a Louis B rownsworth Sr., on June 9, 1868 and passed on in 1924.

John Jacob, born Dec. 1, 1844 died June 11, 1895,. He never married. Daniel Edward was born Sept. 25, 1846, md Lura Ann Oden on June 13, 1880 and passed away Jul. 16, 1922,

Elizabeth met George Mitchel Magerle on the first day on the familys entering the Rogue River Valley. He was working at the meat market at Rock Point, near Gold Hill, Oregon. She was born June 1, 1849 and passed away Aug. 11, 1908.

Sarah Carlina was born Sept. 4, 1850, md Eugene Samuel Trumble April 9, 1884

and passed on July 10, 1889.

In 1853, Jacob decided to go to California to dig for gold so they packed up and left Missouri. They entered Oregon in 1853 at Oregon City, Oregon. After two months from Missouri, another son, Joshua, was born July 4, 1853, a few days after reaching the Big Sandy. Joshua later married Ida May Sherrill.

They went on into the Willamette Valley and in 1855, Nov. 14, Martha Jean

was born. She later wed Frank Howlin.

In 1857 Jacob and his family entered the valley just as the last Indians were being moved to Cow Creek, an Indian Reservation. Jacob intended continuing on south to California but Sarah and the children begged him to stop where they were at Sardine Creek. They settled in at the first place on the right across the present railroad tracks on Sardine Creek.

George II was born Oct. 27, 1857 near Gold Hill, Jackson County, Oregon and was the first white child born in the Rogue Valley. George was named after his first brother who was killed at Corvallis while helping his father build their home. A log had rolled over him. George II married Mary O. Jackson on April 13, 1881.

Ella was born September 14, 1859 near Gold Hill, married Julius T rumble on

April 9, 1884 and passed away on 1928.

Jesse David was born May 5, 1862, married Mary May Oden, July, 1889 and died June 17, 1942, m. James Henry was born Oct. 10, 1865 near Gold Hill and passed on September 10, 1894.

Jacob was the Justice of the Peace at Rock Point and served as a Juror. He was very civic minded and like to help other people. Jacob carried his shoes into Jacksonville and walked barefoot until he got into the city limits so that he could keep them from getting dusty and dirty.

In 1861 there was a terrific rainfall on top of four feet of snow and the Rogue River flooded "from mountain to mountain". Jacob took his family up to the top of the mountain for safety.

After Sarah's death, Jacob remarried within six months. His second wife's name was Sarah too, but after a time they separated and about two years after the first Sarah's death Jacob passed on.
