Ann M. Carder, a Prineville resident passed away on Wednesday, August 25, 2004 at Pioneer Memorial Hospital, she was 86 years old.

Visitation will be held on Tuesday, August 31 from 4 p.m. - 8 p.m. at the Prineville Funeral Home. Funeral Services will be held on Wednesday, September 1, 2004 at 11:30 A.M. at the First Baptist Church in Prineville, with Dr. Barry Gridley officiating. Mrs. Carder was born on October 16, 1917 in Karval, Colo., the daughter of Albert C. & Mary Elizabeth (Chambers) Justice. She attended High School in Gorin, Missouri, graduating in 1935. On March 17, 1936 in Macon, Missouri she was married to James R. Carder. She attended the Prineville First Baptist Church and enjoyed fellowship with the XYZ Group of the First Baptist Church.

She moved to Oregon in 1936, first to Madras, then to

Redmond and then back to Madras. In 1946 she moved to Prineville where her husband built and opened the Copeland Lumber Company. She worked part time at Copeland Lumber Company with her husband until she retired in 1986.

She loved to play cards especially Canasta and Skipbo. She loved the outdoors, raising a flower garden, enjoyed the hot weather and she loved splitting wood. Her family remembers her as a very giving person.

Mrs. Carder is survived by her son Albert and his wife Judy Carder of Gearhart, Oregon and daughter Pam and her husband Jerry Moseley of Bend Oregon and daughter Judy Major of Bend, Oregon. Brothers John Justice of Smithville, Missouri and Albert "Ace" Justice of Burlison, Texas. Sisters Betty Gold of Baton Rouge, Louisiana and Erma Palmer of Selmar, Calif. 10 grandchildren and 19 great grandchildren. Mrs. Carder was preceded in death by her parents, husband, and one sister.
