Joan Loretta Gerke, 91, a lifelong resident of Prineville, passed away July 6 in Reno, Nev.

with graveside services to follow. A celebration of her life will be held at noon July 16 at St. Joseph's Parish Hall.

Joan was born Aug. 25, 1924, in Prineville to George and Jenny (McCullough) Meyer. She was raised a few blocks from her father's business on Main Street, which was located next to the building that is now the Horseshoe Tayern. That

business was a furniture store/mortuary, a common combination in that time period. Joan and her childhood friends considered Prineville to be there "oyster" in which they felt free to roam and play. Joan attended all 12 years of schooling in Prineville and graduated from Crook County High School in 1942.

After graduation, she worked at the JC Penney store for four years and was part of the Prineville Ambulance Corp during World War II. She married Maurice Gerke (also a graduate of Crook County High School) in 1945 when he was home on leave from the Marine Corps. They then moved back to Prineville and bought a home on Lamonta Road across the road from Pine Products, one of several lumber mills in the Prineville area at that time. Maurice went to work for Pine Products, and they lived in the Lamonta house until Maurice's death in 2011. Joan raised five boys in the Lamonta house, and she always felt lucky to have such a great neighborhood for her family to live, work and play. It was not uncommon to have eight to 12 children playing in the yard on a summer day. She valued her neighbors and was always willing to give whatever assistance was needed.

Joan liked to be with her large family and countless friends and hosted many anniversaries, birthdays and wedding receptions at the family home. She was a lifelong member of St. Joseph Catholic Church. She was also a member of the St. Joseph's Altar Society and dedicated many hours of her time to church functions.

An avid Notre Dame fan, she rarely missed an opportunity to watch her team play. Joan was sure to attend all of her son's activities, whether those activities were school plays or sporting events, Joan would be there rain, snow or shine. Many miles were put on the family car while attending out-of-town games.

Her hobbies included bowling, Etudier Book Club, bridge club, pinochle and slot machines. Joan was well known in Prineville and always had a good word or witty comment to almost everyone she met. Her sense of humor was almost legendary in the Prineville area. You never knew what funny thing she would come up with each time you saw her.

She is survived by her sons, Dennis and wife, Jan, of Eagle Point, Rockford and wife, Lila, George and wife, Sue, of Prineville, Kipley and wife, Joan, and Fred and wife, Deb, of Bend; 11 grandchildren; and 12 great-grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her parents, her husband of 66 years, her brother Aaron Brown, and her sisters Mary Green, Lena Plymell, Katie Stevens and Georgia Adams.
