BY LAWS OF THE  
ROGUE VALLEY GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY

as adopted November 3, 1965  
Revised 1967  
Revised May 8, 1968

ARTICLE I-NAME

The name of this organization shall be the Rogue Valley Genealogical Society.

ARTICLE II - OBJECT

The object of this Society shall be:

1. To acquire genealogical information to be shared among the members.
2. To build up the Society's library and exchange with others.
3. To publish genealogical and historical information in bulletin form.
4. To create interest in genealogy.
5. To seek genealogical and historical knowledge.
6. To preserve and perpetuate the records of our ancestors and the founders of our Country.
7. To compile and prepare records.
8. To provide and maintain a surname file and also a file for charts on family lines for those members wishing to participate and wish to freely exchange such data with other members.
9. To pool interests and aid individual members of the Society in the compilation of their family genealogies and histories.

ARTICLE III - POLICIES

1. This Society shall be non-profit, non-political and non-sectarian.
2. This Society is not affiliated with any other organization, but will help, share, and exchange genealogical information.

ARTICLE IV - MEMBERSHIP AND DUES

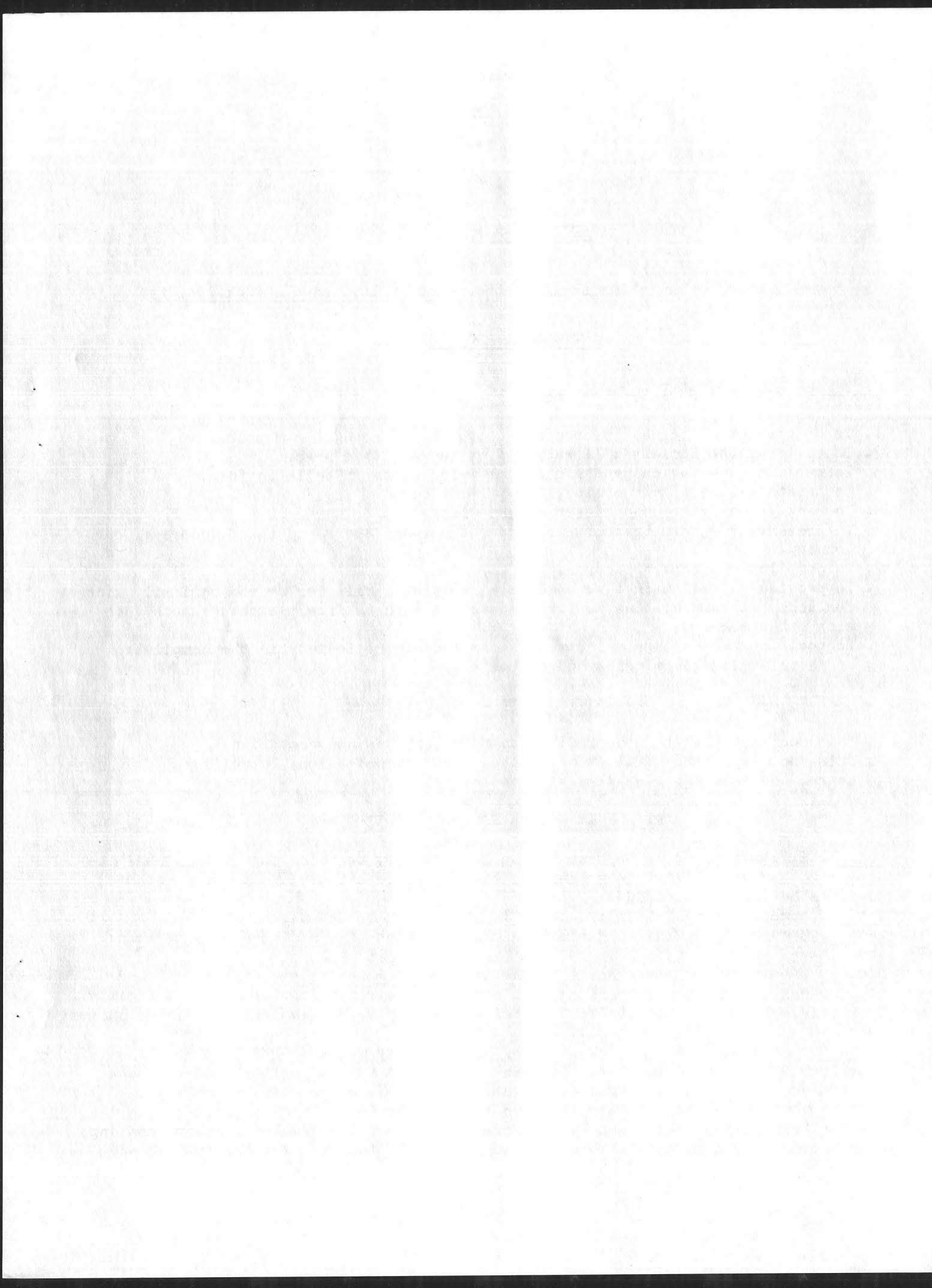
Sec. 1. Eligibility for membership in the Rogue Valley Genealogical Society shall be determined by an interest in genealogy, biography and history and the payment of dues, as hereinafter provided.

Sec. 2. Members joining before January 1, 1966 shall be Charter Members.

Sec. 3. Membership in this organization shall consist of two classes; subscribing and active.

Sec..4. Subscribing members shall be limited to all genealogical, historical and other organizations and libraries which exchange their publications for the Society quarterly, or which subscribe to the Society quarterly for their files at the current rate.

Sect. 5. Active members in good standing are the only members who shall have the privilege of making motions, debating and voting and holding office. Annual dues for active members shall be due and payable on or before the January meeting. Members whose dues are not paid by March 1, shall be automatically dropped from the roll, after after notice given by the Treasurer before the regular February meeting. When there are two or more members in one household, the dues for the additional member shall be one-half of the regular rate, provided that only the initial or





Sec. 7. An Office shall be declared vacant when the officers have been absent from four consecutive meetings without adequate reason.

#### ARTICLE VIII

##### HERALD:

The Herald shall be a member of the Publicity Committee with one specified duty of notifying the members of meetings, both regular and special.

#### ARTICLE IX

##### HISTORIAN:

The Historian shall compile data and prepare the Society's History.

#### ARTICLE X

##### PARLIAMENTARIAN:

The Parliamentarian shall furnish instructions in the parliamentary procedure, and render decisions upon request of the President. Roberts Rules of Order (Revised) shall govern this society in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these by-laws.

#### ARTICLE XI

##### AUDITING COMMITTEE:

The auditing committee shall examine the Society's accounts just prior to the annual meeting and being satisfied with the Treasurer's report and other reports shall sign a statement at the end of the report that they find the reports in order.

#### ARTICLE XII

##### FISCAL YEAR:

The fiscal year shall be from January 1 through December 31.

#### ARTICLE XIII

##### STANDING COMMITTEES:

###### Section A.

The Finance Committee shall determine requirements and compile the annual budget; devise ways and means to extend and supplement the society's income; be responsible for maintenance of Surname Index material and library supplies.

###### Section B.

The Program Committee shall plan, arrange and conduct programs for the regular meetings of the Society, including special interest groups.

###### Section C.

The Publicity Committee shall develop contacts with publicity media; and furnish publicity materials.

###### Section D.

The Publications Committee shall be responsible for publication of the Quarterly bulletin and such other publications not otherwise assigned.

###### Section E.

The Membership Committee shall devise ways and means to obtain new members. The Chairman shall receive dues and issue receipts and or membership cards; and keep and supply a current listing of all paid members; and pay to the Treasurer all monies collected.

Section F.

The Librarian shall collect and accept genealogical materials for the Society; shall catalog and keep accurate records of all such materials that she collects. The records shall be made accessible to all members for search and copy with permission from the Society on the copying. Copies made for non members may be done so for a fee with permission of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE XIV

BOARD OF DIRECTORS:

The Board of Directors shall consist of all members of the Organization Committee. The board shall have authority over the affairs of the Society between meetings, and such other business that the Society may refer to it.

The Board shall submit reports at the regular meetings of the Society.

The Board shall appoint at least two weeks before the annual meeting an auditing committee to audit the accounts of the Treasurer and any other books kept by the Society.

The Board shall prepare and submit to the society for approval, a budget for the fiscal year.

It shall approve routine bills within the limits of the budget.

Approve any forms set up by the Society.

The Board shall serve as a Finance Committee.

A Board position may be declared vacant in the event of non attendance at regular meeting four times in consecutive order, without adequate reason. In this event or by resignation, this position shall be filled by vote of other Board Members.

ARTICLE XV

NOMINATION & ELECTION

Section A. Nomination.

1. There shall be a nominating committee consisting of three members to be appointed by the President with the approval of the Board at least one month prior to the election meeting. The committee will appoint its own chairman.

2. The nominating committee shall select at least one willing nominee for each office to be filled and report at the election meeting.

3. Following the report of this committee, an opportunity shall be given for nominations from the floor.

A vacancy occurring in an office shall be filled by a majority vote of the executive board.

Section B. Election.

Officers shall be elected at the regular December meeting and installed at the January Meeting.

Election shall be by ballot, however, if there is only one candidate for any office, on motion by the floor election may be by voice vote.

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SPECIAL NOTICE:

It has become necessary to raise our membership dues, due to the increased cost of printing and compiling our bulletins, as well as growth of our organization and postal rate increase, along with other expenses.

It was voted upon at our May 8th meeting and unanimously approved by a very substantial majority of the members to raise our dues to \$6.00 per year per member, with half rate for each additional member in the family with one bulletin per family. The rates are to run from January through December. If dues are not paid by February of the year your bulletins will not be sent to you.

Those joining in June or later may pay \$3.00 for the balance of the year, if they desire all four bulletins, however, they must pay the full \$6.00 or \$1.50 for each bulletin desired.

This was made retroactive to January 1, 1968.

All future bulletins will be printed by the printer instead of being mimeographed.

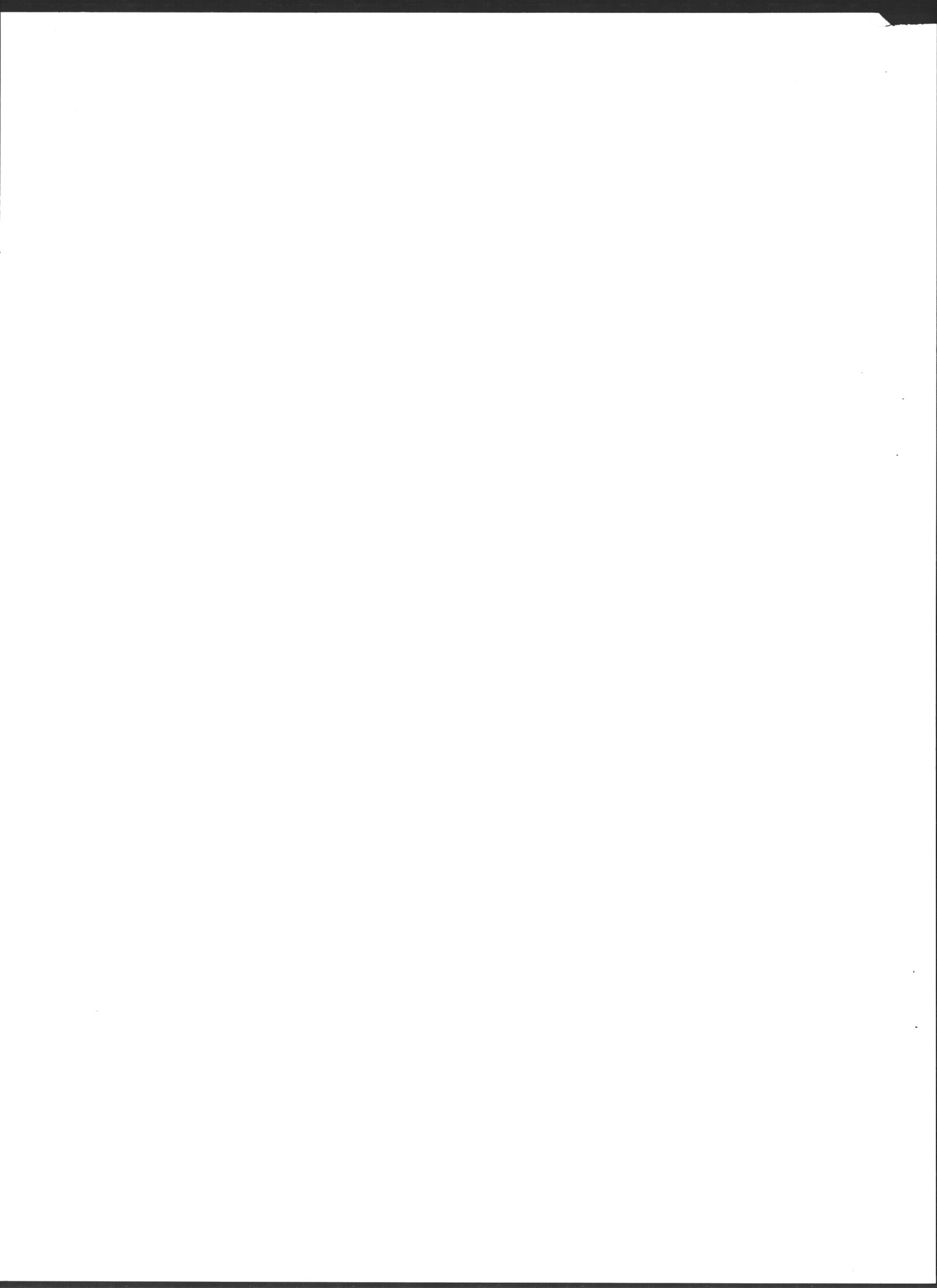

Collins Forbes was strongly solicited to come to Texas during the days of the republic but refused to leave the United States. Soon after the annexation of this state, however, in 1845, he removed to Texas and eventually made a permanent settlement in Travis County, not far from Austin. He was a busy and careful man and he improved a good farm. He also engaged in teaching school and was a pioneer preacher, being one of the first to advocate the Presbyterian doctrines in this country. He was closely associated with both the intellectual and moral progress of the community and he organized many churches throughout Texas, becoming a noted minister of his day and a famous Bible student. He died in Williamson County at the ripe old age of 83 yrs, while his wife, who bore the maiden name of Mary Robertson, died at the age of 90 years. She was the daughter of John Robertson of Scotch descent, who was a native of Virginia, and he was a wheelwright and farmer. In the family of Colin Forbes were ten children: Elizabeth, Allen, Cynthia J., Mary, Gipson, John, Sarah, Margaret, Harvey and Emily."

#### Thomas Collin Puckett & Family

Thomas Collin Puckett, first child of Lorenzo Dow Puckett and Sarah Forbes Puckett, was born in or near the town of Helena, Karnes County, Texas, 17 Nov 1855, and died in Brownwood, Texas, 21 Nov 1918. His obituary was printed in the 21 Nov 1918 issue of the Brownwood Bulletin, and contained the following:

"Thomas C. Puckett died this morning at 12:40. Thomas C. Puckett was born in Karnes County, Texas, on 17 November 1855. He was married to Miss Louisa Darby of Georgetown on 16 Oct 1879. He moved to Brownwood from Eastland County with his family in 1900, and he made his home here since. He was a member of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church and he had been an active member of the church here until the time of his death. He was a broad-minded man, always ready to help those in distress and need. He had been ill a few days suffering with asthma and heart trouble, however the last evening he seemed to be much better and not until Mrs. Puckett was awakened by his heavy breathing was anyone aware that his condition was serious. Help was summoned at once but he passed away without gaining consciousness."

Louisa Carolina Darby, who married Thomas C. Puckett, was born near Anderson, South Carolina, 16 Sep 1855. She was a daughter of Rev. James Darby and wife, Elizabeth White Darby. Elizabeth White was born in Ireland of Irish parentage,

and when very small her parents and their children emigrated to the United States. Elizabeth White Darby died in South Carolina. About August 12, 1857, her husband and their several children moved to Florida and lived at a community called Shell Pond until Jan 21, 1863. Rev. James Darby died and was buried in Duval County, Florida. Upon the death of her father, Louisa Darby became a member of the family of an older sister, Jane Darby Binkley, wife of Nathan Gardner Binkley, and during the War between the States resided at a village then called Archer Station (now Archer) in Alachua County, Florida, about fifteen miles southwest of Gainesville, the county seat. Following the war, the Binkley family, including Louisa Darby, left Florida and traveled overland to Texas, settling first near Mt. Pleasant, Titus County, in 1872, and a year later they removed to and settled at or near Georgetown in Williamson County, Texas. Additional facts are here copied from the obituary of Mrs. Louisa Puckett in the Brownwood Bulletin of Wednesday, 9 Jan. 1935.

"Mrs. Lou Carolina Puckett, age eighty four years died yesterday afternoon at 6 O'clock at a local hospital after an illness of a few days duration. Survivors are: two daughters, Miss Bertha Puckett of Brownwood and Mrs. H. C. Peyton of Bartlesville, Oklahoma; two sons, C. D. Puckett of Brownwood and H.L. Puckett of Big Lake.

Mrs. Puckett was born 16 Sep 1855, at Anderson, South Carolina, and was the daughter of J. W. and Elizabeth White Darby. When a small child she moved with her family to Florida, she being the youngest of seven children. She and her sister moved to Texas in 1870, they being the only survivors at that time. They located at Georgetown where she was married to Mr. Thomas Puckett, 16 Oct 1879. While at Georgetown, Mr. Puckett was engaged in the stock business and when they moved to West Texas he was engaged in the same business. They moved to Brownwood 34 years ago and reared their family here. Mr. Puckett passed away in 1918. Mrs. Puckett was a member of the First Methodist Church."

The seven children born to Rev. James Darby and his wife, Elizabeth White Darby, were: John (who died while a soldier in the Confederate Army), Mary, Martha, Jane, Sarah, James and Louisa.

NATIONAL ARCHIVES MICROFILM PUBLICATIONS

Guide to the Soundex System used in arranging Indexes to Passenger Lists  
also to 1880 Census Records.

The index cards reproduced in this copy are arranged according to the Soundex filing system. This system, alphabetic for the first letters of the surname and numeric thereunder as indicated by divider cards, keeps together names of the same or similar sounds but of variant spellings.

To search for particular names, you must first work out the code number for the surname of the individual. NO NUMBER IS ASSIGNED TO THE FIRST LETTER OF THE SURNAME. If the passenger's name is Kuhne, for example, the index card will be in "K" segment of the index. The code number for the Kuhne, worked out according to the system below is 500.

The letters, a,e,i,o,u,y,w, and h are NOT coded.

The first letter of a surname is NOT coded.

Every Soundex number must be a 3-digit number. A name yielding no code numbers, as Lee, would be L 000; one yielding only one code would have two zeros added, as Kuhne, coded as K 500; and one yielding two code numbers would have one zero added, as Ebell, coded as E 140.

Not more than three digits are used, so Ebelson would be coded as E 142 NOT E 1425.

When two key letters or equivalents appear together, or one key letter immediately follows or precedes an equivalent, the two are coded as one letter, by a single number, as follows: Kelly, coded as 400; Buerck, coded as 620; Lloyd, coded as 300; and Schaefer, coded as 160.

After determining the code number, such as K 500 for Kuhne, consult the contents listing for this microcopy, which gives the roll breakdown, to locate the roll

on which that code number appears. When looking at a particular roll you will see that if several names are coded as K 500 -- Kam, Abraham, Kann, A.; Kenny, Ann; Kohmi, August and Kuhne, Adam -- the cards will appear in the following order, alphabetical by given name: Kann, A.; Kam, Abraham; Kuhne, Adam; Kenny, Ann; and Kohmi, August.

DIVIDER CARDS ARE USED TO SHOW MOST CODE NUMBERS, BUT NOT ALL. For instance, one divider may be numbered 350 and the next one 400. BETWEEN THE TWO DIVIDER CARDS THERE MAY BE NAMES coded 352, 350, 360, 364, 365 and 355, but instead of being in numerical order they are INTERFILED AND ARRANGED ALPHABETICALLY BY GIVEN NAME.

Such prefixes to surnames as "van", Von, Di, de, le Di, D, dela, or du are sometimes disregarded in alphabetizing and in coding.

Remarks: This is a copy of an 1880 census card researched under the soundex system. The number R 534 is the code number. I checked in the Index code book under the State of Nebraska, under the county of CUMING. This gave me the film serial number as 36600 part 1275. Turning the film to the section listed under the code number in which this particular number (ie R 534) would appear and looked for the name of interest. In this case, the relationship of Hannah to the head of the household, James RANDOLPH, indicate d'm' which designated it for 'mother'. Also on this particular name, two cards were written. #1 see #2 and #2 see #1, indicating that there were two cards because not sufficient room for all the data on the one card.

They have an index book(s) at the Library where serial and part numbers are listed for census and passenger lists. Those under this system are minor as yet but hopes for expansion as help and time can permit.

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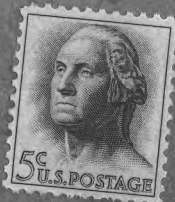
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
