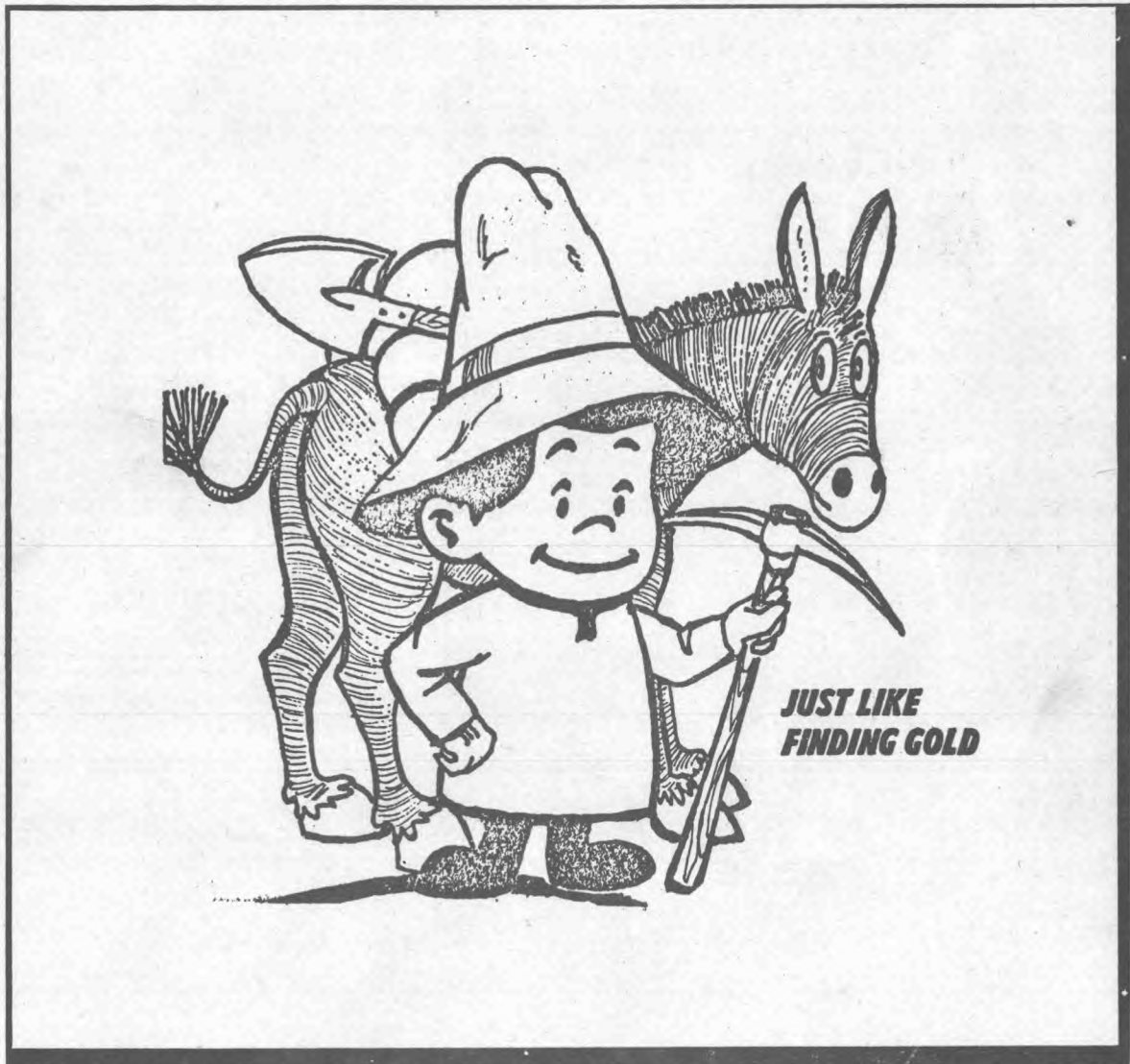

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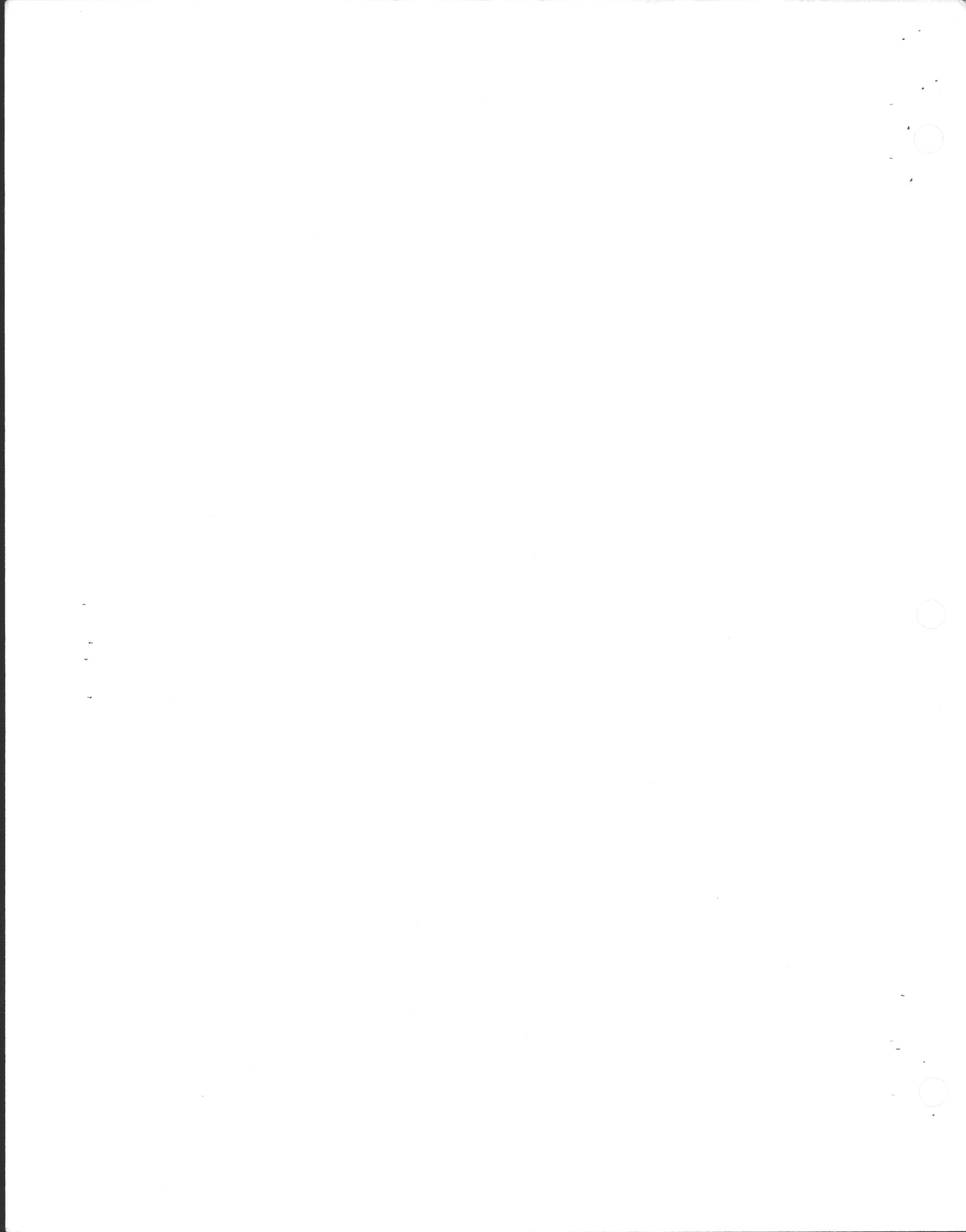
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GLOSSARY FOR GENEALOGISTS

Compiled by Ruby E. Hammersly

The following words may appear in documents or research information encountered by genealogists. Some are obsolete, but many are still used in legal terminology, as I learned in my years as a legal secretary.

Occupational Terms:

- CARTWRIGHT: an artisan who makes or repairs carts
CORDWAINER: Shoemaker
CHIRURGEION: Surgeon
DRAPER: a dealer in cloth and sometimes also in clothing and dry goods
DRUMMER: (also chapman, peddler, hawker) early terms for door-to-door salesmen
FULLING MILL: a mill for fulling cloth by means of pestles or stampers which cleanse it and beat and press it to a close or compact state
HOUSEWRIGHT: a builder of houses
HUSBANDMAN: one who plows and cultivates land; farmer
MERCER: dealer in textile fabrics
SHIP CHANDLER: one who deals in ship supplies
SHIPWRIGHT: one who makes or repairs ships
WHEELWRIGHT: one who makes or repairs wheels and wheeled vehicles, as carts and wagons
WHITESMITH: silversmith; a worker in light metals
WRIGHT: one who makes or constructs; a workman; a mechanic; chiefly used in compound words as shipwright, etc.
YEOMAN: a freeholder of a class below the gentry who worked his own land

Land Record Terms:

- ABSTRACT OF TITLE: a condensed history of the title to land.
BASE LINE: an imaginary line running east and west from an initial point used in surveying the public domain.
BOUNTY LAND: a portion of the public domain given to soldiers for military service by way of bounty, in place of money payment.
DEED: an instrument conveying real property
DEED OF TRUST: a deed that creates a trust.
DEVISEE: the person who receives land or other real property by will
DEVISOR: testator--one who wills land to another
EMINENT DOMAIN: (law) that superior domain of the sovereign power over property within the State which authorizes it to appropriate all or any part thereof to a necessary public use, reasonable compensation being made
FEE SIMPLE: an absolute inheritance, as estate in fee, without condition or restriction.
GRANT: thing or property granted; gift; specifically, a tract of land, a monopoly, or the like granted by the government.

GRANTEE: a person to whom a grant is made

GRANTOR: a person by whom a grant is made

INDENTURE: a deed which originally was made in two parts formed by cutting or tearing a single sheet across the middle in a jagged or indented line that the two parts may be subsequently matched or rematched.

LESSEE: one to whom a lease is given

PACE: a measure of distance, two and one half feet

PATENT: an instrument making a conveyance or grant of public lands; a deed

QUITCLAIM DEED: a deed conveying the interest of the grantor at that time

RANGE: a tier of townships (in surveying) running vertical on the map or north and south. Abbreviated to "R" in describing location of land.

SURVEY: the operation of finding and delineating the contour, dimensions, position, etc., by applying the principles of geometry and trigonometry as of any part of the earth's surfaces; a measured plan and description

Terms in Deeds, Wills, and other legal documents:

AET, AETAT: (abbreviation for Latin aetatis) of age, aged

CONSORT: spouse

CURTILAGE: a yard within the fence surrounding a house

ET AL: (abbreviation for Latin et alii) and others

ETUX: (abbreviation for Latin et usor) and wife. Example: John Jones, etux.

HOLOGRAPHIC: a document wholly in the handwriting of the purported author

KILL: (often cap.) channel, or creek, used chiefly in place names in Delaware and New York

MANUMIT: to release from slavery. (highflown synonym for "free" sometimes used in a will providing for the release of a slave upon the death of the testator)

MESSUAGE: (mes-wij) a dwelling house with the adjacent buildings and curtilage and the adjoining lands used in connection with the household

MOIETY: one of two equal parts; half. One of two approximately equal parts

MORGEN: a Dutch and Southern African unit of land area equal to 2.116 acres

NUNCUPATIVE: not written; oral, as a will.

PERCH: (in land description) a measure of length, equal to $5\frac{1}{2}$ yds; a rod
It is also a measure of area, equal to $30\frac{1}{4}$ sq. yds, and a cubic measure of stone, usually equal to $24\frac{3}{4}$ cu. ft.

POLE: a measurement appearing in land descriptions meaning the same as rod:
 $16\frac{1}{2}$ ft.

RELICT: widow (as relict of John Jones)

FOUND: (n) free food and lodging in addition to wages

HAVERSACK: a sack of oats; a gunner's leather bag used for conveying ammunition to a gun

KINE: plural of "cow"

QUEENSWARE: glazed earthenware of a creamy color

FINDING THE COUSINSHIP BETWEEN TWO RELATED PERSONS

(Taken from Ill. Gen. Soc. Quarterly by Wm. A. Sausaman)

1. Each person counts the number of generations back to their common progenitor.
2. The higher count minus the difference in the two counts minus one equals the number of cousinships.
3. The difference in the two counts equals the number of cousinships removed.

EXAMPLES

1. If both count 6 the difference is zero, so they are fifth cousins. (6-0-1=5)
2. If one counts 7 and the other 5 the difference is 2, so they are fourth cousins twice removed (7-2-2=4) and (7-5=2).
3. If one counts 8 and the other 4 the difference is 4, so they are third cousins four times removed (8-4-1=3) and (8-4=4).

If either counts one the above rules do not apply.

MAUND, SUGGS, HOWELL, BILBREY CONNECTIONS (Con't)

On Jan. 10, 1639, John Howell, Sr., who landed in Virginia about 1637, was granted 150 acres of land for transporting three persons into the colony and a further grant for 212 acres was made March 25, 1663. Both grants were for land in Bristol Parish in Henrico County.

His son, John Howell, Jr. married Elizabeth _____.

Their son, Joseph Howell I., probably born in Virginia, married Mary Starling and died in Edgecombe County. His will, written Jan. 10, 1749 and probated in May, 1750, named his wife, Margaret, and children: Joseph, Thomas, Mary, Murphrey and Martha." (This must have been a second wife. LVdP)

ESTATE RECORDS OF EDGECOMBE COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA 1730-1820, by Joseph W. Watson (1970), gives the inventory action and sale settlement; ABSTRACTS OF WILLS, EDGECOMBE COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA 1733-1855, by Williams and Griffin, gives an abstract of the will also.

HOWELL, Major JOSEPH, inventory taken by Margaret Howell, and Thomas Howell, exrs., Aug. 17, 1750, Aug. Ct. 1750. Account of sale by Sam'l Ruffin, D. Sheriff, Feb. Ct. 1750 (1751). Inventory of book debts taken by Margret Howell, exrx., May Ct. 1753. Orphan Thom's Howell chose his brother, Joseph Howell, as guardian, Sept. 26, 1758. (Ct. Min.) Orphan Murphry Howell chose her brother, Joseph Howell, as guardian, March 27, 1759. Joseph Howell was appointed guardian to his sister, Martha Howell, March 27, 1759. (Ct. Min) Inventory returned for an infant orphan, Matha (Martha) Howell, Feb. Ct. 1762. (Ct. Min.)

The will of Joseph Sr., stated that his son, Joseph, Jr. should be declared "of age" at 18 years of age, which would have been in 1751. There are many records in various categories in Edgecombe County for Joseph I., and Joseph II, and for the different Sugg families.

In 1758 or 1759, Joseph II's brother Thomas Howell died, still a minor, and his estate is listed in the Inventory and Estate Records.

HOWELL (HOWEL), THOMAS, Decd, a Minor, administration granted to Joseph Howel. Inventory returned by the admr. Division of estate ordered by the Court, June 26, 1759. (Ct. Min.) Ordered that the estate be appraised and divied among Joseph Howel; Mary, the wife of Wm. Maund; Murfry Howel; and Martha Howell, the legal representatives of said decd., Sept. 26, 1759. (Ct. Min.) Ordered that the estate be sold by the Sheriff on the second Thursday in Nov. next in order to make distribution thereof, Sept. Ct. 1760. (Ct. Min.)

The Thomas Howell, executor of Joseph Howell's estate, was a brother of the deceased.

It is felt that Esther Sugg and Joseph Howell II must have married by the time he was 19 or 20. The Fort books says he and Esther were divorced in 1759, but from all I can find, I believe the date would be closer to 1765. To find the exact date would mean hiring a professional research to go through the boxes of legislation action for North Carolina, for the years 1759 to 1765, which can be an expensive proposition. In those years, divorces were granted only by an Act of the Legislature in North Carolina.

The Bible records book continues on the Howell Family, by showing that Joseph Howell I, was Justice of the Peace in Edgecombe County, 1746-49, was member of the Assembly from Edgecombe, 1746-1749, and Speaker of the Assembly, June 12, 1747. (N.C. Colonial Records, Vol IV, pp. 813, 966, 815.)

Joseph Howell, II, born Edgecombe County, N. C. 1733; d. DeKalb County, Georgia, 1835 (he would have been age 102!). He married first Esther Sugg, daughter of Aquilla Sugg. (Data on Aquilla Sugg found in N. C. Colonial Records, Vol. VII, pp. 64-65; Vol. IV, p. 977; Vol V pp. 54-55-195) He and his wife Esther Sugg Howell gave fifty acres of land to be used for a town common and ten acres for public buildings in establishing the town of Tarboro, county seat of Edgecombe. (D. Bk. 00, p. 161).

ABSTRACTS OF EARLY DEEDS OF EDGECOMBE COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA 1759-1772, by Joseph W. Watson (1966) shows:

DB 00-161 -- JOSEPH HOWELL and wife, ESTHER, of Edgecombe Co. to JAMES MOIR, AQUILA SUGG, LAURENCE TOOLE, ELISHA BATTLE AND BENJAMIN HART, all of Edgecombe Co., Sept 22, 1760, for 5 s Proclamation money a one year lease on a tract of 150 acres on the south bank of Tar River at the mouth of Mill Creek. Wit: John Drew, Thomas Lenoir, Jos. Moore.

DB 00-166 -- Bond given by Rev'd JAMES MOIR, LAURANCE TOOL, Merch't, Capt. AQUILA SUGG, ELISHA BATTLE, and BENJAMIN HART, Esqrs., Sept. 24, 1760, for the following purpose, to wit, "Whereas there in one hundred and fifty acres of land where the said Howell now lives and being part of the plantation he lives on laid out for the use of building and erecting a town thereon and the above bouden the Rev'd James Moir, Laurence Toole, Mercht., and Capt. Aquila Sugg, Elisah Battle, and Benjamin Hart, Esqrs. are appointed Commisoners to let out the same and they having received full power and alwful authority from him the said Joseph Howell to lay out in lotts the above said one hundred and fifty acres of land excepting on lott where the ssid Howell's house stands and the graveyard and dispose of the same in lots not exceeding one-half acre to a lott and the streets to be laid out at the discretion of said Commissioners not exceeding eighty feet wide and the above said Commissioners are immediately to enter upon the same and cause the above tract of land to be laid out in lotts except fifty acres for commons for the use of the said Town wihtout delay and take subscriptions for the same at two pounds Proclamation Money for each lott and the same to receive and well and truly render and pay to him the said Joseph Howell, his heirs or assigns, all such sum or sums of money as received at the rate of two pounds Proc. as above metnioned per lott, except twelve lotts for the use of Public Buildings." Wit: John Drew, Thomas Lenoir, Jos. Moore.

The follows in deed books records of many sales of the lots to various people. The establishment of a "legal" town was made necessary by the county seat having been cut off into the new county of Halifax in 1759. In fact, all the records of Edgecombe County, from its forming about 1736 from Bertie County, were left in the Courthouse in Halifax County, so you find Edgecombe County deed books, the first six, in the courthouse in Halifax! Apparently Joseph Howell II was intent on making a good amount of money from the land sold to the "city fathers" of Tarboro, but as it looks later this did not come about, or else he lost it on other ventures.

DB 00-296 -- JOSPEH HOWELL and wife, ESTHER, of Edgecombe Co. to THOMAS NEAL of same, June 25, 1761, for 115 a tract of 50 acres on the north side of Tar River on the Indian Creek at the head of Bearskin Swash. Wit: Thomas (T) Newsum, Thomas (T) Goodson, John (X) Mare.

From these records I do not believe that Joseph divorced Esther in 1759. There are many records given in Deed Book 1, with Joseph II signing as a witness, or as the land adjoining some of his. There is no mention of Esther. In Deed Book C. Index there are many listings of Howell, or of Joseph Howell, and two of Esther Howell. Again many of the records show Joseph signing as a witness or as the land having adjoined land he owned, or that the land was previously owned by him (or Joseph I). Then:

DB C-425 --JOSEPH HOWELL of Edgecombe Co., planter, appointed NOAH SUGG of same as his attorney, Dec. 1766, to demand and recover all of that which was due and payable to him. Acknowledged in open court.

(This Noah Sugg would be Joseph's brother-in-law, as Noah married his sister Murphrey, and Joseph married Noah's sister, Esther. And with him appointed attorney, there seems to have been no animosity, which would have been normal if Joseph had just divorced Esther! Sure wish I knew more about this couple! LVdP.)

The Bible Records book states the Joseph Howell II, was a member of the Assembly from Edgecombe April 13, 1762-Feb. 7, 1764. He is supposed to have moved to Mecklenburg Co. in 1765 and married the second time in 1768 to Margaret Eleanor Garmon in Anson Co. (She died there 1795.)

(Then the book makes the statement that "Child of Joseph Howell II, and wife Esther Sugg: Keziah Howell, b. circa 1773, m. 1790 Joseph Davis.") (More later on this).

Esther Sugg Howell signed many documents as a witness also, and many times the main names would include her father Aquilla Sugg, then in 1767 is:

DB C-484 -- Joseph Moore, Sheriff of Edgecombe Co., to JAMES DUNLOP, merchant, of Nansemond Co., Virginia, May 14, 1767, at public sale for £ 17 Proc. money a tract of 40 acres, sold as the property of JOSEPH HOWELL. It was part of a Granville grant for 322 acres made to said Howell bearing date May 14, 1756. Wit: Esther Howell, James Braswell, Samuel Cook.

DB C-486 -- Joseph Moore, Sheriff of Edgecombe Co., to HENRY IRWIN of same, Oct. 15, 1767, at public sale for £10 Proc. money the remainder of the tract of land whereon the Town of Tarborough was situated, a tract of 50 acres on the river and Mill Creek (called otherwise Hendrick's or Holley's) adjoining the Town boundary. This land was sold as the property of JOSEPH HOWELL. Wit: Richard Bell, Thomas Carter.

DB C-488 -- JAMES DUNLOP of Nansemond Co., Virginia to AQUILLA SUGG of Edgecombe Co., May 18, 1767, for £50 Proc. money one lot in the Town of Tarborough known as Lot No. 113 in the plan of the town. It was conveyed by the Commissioners to Joseph Howell on June 22, 1761 and bought by James Dunlop from Joseph Moore, Sheriff, at public sale. Wit: Jos. Moore, Benjamin Bunn.

DB C-501 -- Joseph Moore, Sheriff of Edgecombe Co., to JAMES DUNLOP of Nansemond Co., Virginia, May 13, 1767, at public sale for £42 one lot in the Town of Tarborough known as Lot No. 113 in the plan of the town, sold as the property of JOSEPH HOWELL. Wit: Henry Irwin, Henry Irwin Toole.

DB C-510 -- Joseph Moore, Sheriff of Edgecombe Co., to ROBERT KILLEBREW, tailor, of same, May 14, 1767, at public sale for £150 Proc. money a tract of 300 acres on Toyancoque adjoining Wm. Curtis, as per patent granted to John Davis on March 21, 1742/43. This land was sold as the property of JOSEPH HOWELL. Wit: Samuel Ruffin, Jas. Dunlop.

DB C-522 -- Joseph Moore, Sheriff of Edgecombe Co., to Reverend Mr. HENRY MOIR of Auchtertool in North Britain, heir to the Reverend M. James Moir, late of Edgecombe Co., decd., Feb. 24, 1768, at public sale for £42 9d paid by James Gibson and Green Hill, executors to said James Moir, a tract of 278 1/2 acres adjoining John Creel and Howell, sold as the property of JOSEPH HOWELL at the instance of James Dunlop. Wit: Edward Hall, Robt. Bignall.

DB C-525 -- Rev'd HENRY MOIR of North Britain to ROBERT BIGNALL of Edgecombe Co., April 15, 1768, for £316 Proc. money several tracts of land comprising 1020 acres: (1) 742 acres purchased by Rev. James Moir from Robert Webb and wife, Elizabeth, which was conveyed to him by three deeds and devised by him to said Henry Moir; (2) the residue purchased by said Henry Moir from Joseph Moore, Sheriff, at the sale of the property of Joseph Howell. Wit: Jas. Hall, Thos. H. Hall, Wm. McClellan.

DB C-474 --JAMES DUNLOP of Nansemond Co., Virginia to THOMAS HOWELL, SENR., "lawful of Major Joseph Howell" of Edgecombe Co., May 14, 1767, for £17 Proc. money a tract of land sold that day to said Dunlop by Sheriff of Edgecombe Co. at public sale as the property of Joseph Howell, it being part of a Granville grant of 325 acres bearing date May 14, 1756. Wit: Joseph Moore, James Braswell, Samuel Cook.

With all his land sold off -- to pay creditors? -- Joseph Howell had reason to go to another county, and by the time the last of this was settled, he was married again, according to the information in the book on Edgecombe Co. Bible Records. In Deed Book O there is one mention of Esther Howell, as a witness, and there is seven for Joseph Howell. Some of them were executed before those in Book C., but were recorded in this book which only has 355 pages.

DB O-243 --EARL GRANVILLE grant to JOSEPH HOWELL of Edgecombe Co., June 1, 1762, a tract of 455 acres adjoining the plantation where on said Howell then lived, his Mill land, his Meadow plantation land, his old plantation land, as well as the lands of Davis, Rev. James Moir, and Crocker. Wit: Jno. Linton. Proved by the oath of Joseph Montfort.

DB O-247 --EARL GRANVILLE grant to JOSEPH HOWELL of Edgecombe Co., Aug 1, 1762, a tract of 360 acres adjoining the old plantation of Capt. Joseph Howell and the lands of Jacob Jones and Crocker. Wit: John Linton. Proved by the oath of Joseph Montfort.

DB O-316 --NOAH SUGG, having been invested with power of attorney by Joseph Howell in Dec. 1766 to demand and recover all money due him, appointed JAMES DUNLOP and ANTHONY WARWICK, Gent., of Nansemond Co., Virginia and JOHN PARSONS, Gent. of Southampton Co., Virginia as true and lawful attorneys to act under him, Feb. 28, 1767. Wit: Jas. Hall.

In Deed Book D there is mention of the children of Joseph and Esther (Sugg) Howell, plus more public sale information and witnessing by Esther. But Deed Book D. p. 31, shows that the divorce has taken place. It says:

AQUILA SUGG OF Edgecombe Co. gave in trust to LEMUEL SUGG and ELIAS FORT of same, March 3, 1769, a negro wench and her three children, for the benefit of his daughter, ESTHER HOWELL, wife of Joseph Howell, the Elder, and her minor children, JOSEPH HOWELL, JUNR., MURPHREE HOWELL, ELIZABETH HOWELL, AND KEZIAH HOWELL. Esther Howell was to receive the annual profits arising from the labor of the salves during her lifeteime and they were to be equally divided among her four children after her decease. Wit: Abraham Tison, William Mace, William Long."

There is some who state that this was the complete list of the children of this couple, but in Volume II, ABSTRACTS OF EARLY DEEDS OF EDGECOMBE COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA, 1772-1788, we find mention of another child. The index to Deed Book 2, this volume gives three listings for Joseph Howell, one shows that land previous had belonged to him. The other was another on public sale; the last was obviously a witnessed signed by Joseph III, in 1773.

DB 2-38 -- Joseph Moore, Sheriff of Edgecombe Co., to HENRY IRWIN of same, May 4, 1767, at public sale for 10 pds. Proc. money all the remainder of the Town Lands of JOSEPH HOWELL, bounded by Holley's Creek, the land granted for the use of the Town of Tarborough, and Tar River, sold at the instance of James Dunlop. Wit: John (X) Morris, David Scarbrough.

DB 2-159 -- MALACHI MAUND of Norfolk Co., Virginia to WILLIAM SUGG, Dec. 20, 1773, for 100 pds. current money a tract of 150 acres on the south bank of Tar River and on Crooked Creek adjoining William Williams and Mitchell (formerly Nath'l Hickman), it being a patent granted to William Williams on July 11, 1739. Wit: Aquila Sugg, Archibald White, Joseph Howell (The last two are brothers-in-law).

There is one mention of Esther in Deed Book 3, as a witness, but there is several mentions of adjoining land of Joseph Howell, and there are transactions between Joseph Howell III, and others.

In Deed Book E., there is one mention of Esther (Easter), and two of a Thomas Howell, and many other Howells, some relatives, some of which I am not sure.

DB E-179 -- THOMAS HOWELL of Edgecombe Co. to JOSEPH HOWELL of same, Feb. 21, 1781, for 37 pds. 10 sh. hard money a tract of 40 acres on the south side of Tar River and south side of Hendrick's Creek adjoining Matthew Humphrey and Southerland. Said Thomas Howell reserved the lifetime right that his mother, Easter Howell, possessed in the said land, nor could it be sold without her permission. Wit: Noah Sugg, Kezia (X) Howell, Elizabeth (X) Howell, Reveca (X) Wells.

This gives us what must be an older child of Esther and Joseph Howell. He could have been born by 1751 or 1752, if they married soon after Joseph came "of age", but why he is not mentioned in the deed of gift is a matter of conjecture.

There is an error in the Bible Records book, as it gives Joseph Howell III, as the son of Margaret Eleanor (Gorman) Howell, and also Elizabeth Howell as her daughter. And from the deed of gift we see that Joseph and Elizabeth were Esther's children, unless Joseph Howell III allowed his second wife to also name children with these so common names.

I believe that Thomas Howell, Joseph Howell, Junr., Elizabeth Howell, Kezia Howell, and Murphrey Howell were all the children of Joseph Howell II, and Esther Sugg Howell. If Esther was born ca 1736 or 1737, she would have been old enough to marry by 1750-1752 (many girls married at 12 to 16), and if her first child was born ca 1752, and the divorce was ca 1765, the oldest could have been 13 by that time. Another supposition could be that Thomas Howell was born after the divorce, and that Joseph Howell never acknowledged him. I just don't know.

In the Bible Records book, the history of the Howell family gives: "During the Revolution, Joseph Howell, II was a member of the Militia of Mecklenburg Co., N.C. as a foot soldier in Capt. Adam Alexander's Company, having enlisted June 6, 1776, and fought in the Battles of Guilford Court House and King's Mountain, also furnishing supplies and money to the Continental Army. His name is on the monument at King's Mountain. (Colonial Records, Vol. IV, pp. 823, 855, 863, 903, 1176; Vol VI, pp. 801, 818, 845, 895, 1098, 1158)

In KINFOLKS OF EDGECOMBE COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA 1788-1855, by Joseph W. Watson (1969), there are several mentions of Esther Howell, and in several she is associated with Nathaniel Bilbary, which I knew was our ancestor, the father of Mary Bilbrey who married Redding Bonner. I sent and got the deeds listed, as the abstracts gave them as "tenants-in-common" in property.

Deed Book 6, pp. 366-369:

KNOW all men by these presents that Esther Howell, Joseph Davis, Nathaniel Bilbary, Sterling Waller and Blake Howell all of the County of Edgecombe and State of North Carolina for & in Consideration of the Sum of Forty-five pounds Virginia money in hand paid by Joseph Howell of the County and State aforessid the receipt whereof is herby Acknowledged have Granted Bargained & Sold and do by these presents Grant Bargain and Sell set over & deliver for to the proper use and benefit of Joseph Howell his Heirs or Assigns Two Negroes Castle & Holly and their increase we the said Esther Howell, Joseph Davis, Nathaniel Bilbary, Sterling Waller & Blake Howell do by these presents Bind ourselves, Each & Every of us, our & each of our Heirs, Executors, Administrators & Assignes to Warrant and forever defent unto the said Joseph Howell his Heirs & Assigns for ever from the lawfull Claim of any Person whatever. In witness whereof we have herunto set our hands and seals this 31st of January 1792.

I have given the name Bilbary as Mr. Watson spelled it in his book KINFOLKS, but in the xeroxed copy of the originals I believe it was spelled Bilbory, as it was on Nathaniel Bilbory's pension application in 1832. The people listed in this deed was Esther Howell, the mother of Joseph Howell, the mother-in-law of Joseph Davis, Sterling Waller, and Nathaniel Bilbory. I feel that Blake Howell could have been a son of Thomas Howell, hence a grandson of Esther. The slaves were those, or rather part of those, given to Esther and her children, by the deed of gift by her father. During the many years left in his life Aquilla Sugg seems to have tried, more or less, to provide for Esther, first giving her a home on his land, and later, when he sold the land to his son, writing into the deed the stipulation that she was to live on the place. This is in Deed Book 4, page 632.

"LEMUEL SUGG of Edgecombe Co. bond to ESTHER HOWELL of same, Nov. 14, 1768. The condition of the Obligation was that a considerable time past Aquila Sugg, father of Lemuel Sugg, sold a tract of land to said Lemuel, it being the new dwelling house of said Aquila. It was agreed that said Aquila Sugg and wife, Elizabeth Sugg, and said Esther Howell should live on the plantation for and during their natural lives, and the children of said Esther should live with her until they married and no longer. Wit: Noah Sugg, William Mace, William Long."

I have heard that in the agreement was the stipulation that Joseph Howell II was never to come on this land where Esther was living.

Keziah Howell married Joseph Davis; Elizabeth Howell married Sterling Waller; and I am not sure who Joseph Howell married. The child we are interested in is Murphree Howell, apparently the youngest of the group, at least she was mentioned last in the deed of gift. (More about her later.)

Whether it was the strain of supporting Esther, his daughter, in her troubles, or bad investments, or over-investing, we do not know, but in 1771 we find Aquila Sugg selling off land, both in the country and in town. Maybe he felt he should retrench, as he was 65 years of age. Anyway, he made the following deals:

DB D-298 -- AQUILA SUGG of Edgecombe Co., erchant, to ANTHONY BACON, Esq. of the City of London, merchant, Feb. 13, 1771, for £75 Proc. money a tract of 150 acres on the north side of Town Creek adjoining Solomon Nettle and J. Hurod. Wit: George Brownrigg, Wllm. Langton, William Long.

DB D-299 -- AQUILA SUGG of Edgecombe Co., merchant, to ANTHONY BACON, Esq. of the City of London, merchant, Feb. 13, 1771, for £250 Proc. money a tract of 460 acres on the bank of Hendrick's Creek adjoining William Davis, Wm. Sugg, and Robt. Humphrey. Wit: George Brownrigg, Willm. Langton, William Long.
