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OLIVE ANN OATMAN



OLIVE AND LORENZO OATMAN

Of all of the families traveling west to California and Oregon by wagon train, one of the most famous in their own time was the **Oatmans**. **Olive & Lorenzo OATMAN**'s book, "Life among the Indians" was so successful the first edition, published in July 1857, sold out in three weeks with orders for most of the second edition. Later editions published as "Captivity of the Oatman Girls" on the east coast numbered more than 27,000 copies.

After dissention and religious prejudice had scattered their wagon train, the OATMAN family found themselves traveling alone from Pima Village, New Mexican Territory, with one wagon, and meager provisions. Roys Boise OATMAN, his wife Mary Ann Sperry OATMAN and their seven children, became stranded on an island in the Gila River. As the morning of March 19th, 1851 arrived, a band of 19 Yavapai Indians approached demanding food. Having none to offer them, the Indians attacked the family with clubs. Only the two middle girls, Olive age 13 and Mary Ann age 7, were spared. The girls were forced to run with the Indians to their village, covering nearly 200 miles in four days. At the village they became slaves and were badly treated.

Left for dead with the remaining members of his family, the oldest son **Lorenzo** age 15, regained consciousness and managed to crawl to the wagon road. He was found by another wagon train and taken to Fort Yuma to recover. When the garrison was relocated to San Diego, CA **Lorenzo** went with his doctor, **Dr. H.S.HEWIT**, to San Francisco, CA.

After a year with the Yavapai, the girls were sold to a band of Mojave Indians who treated them well, but still considered them slaves. To mark them as Mojave slaves, the girls were given the traditional tattoo on the chin. Olive would always be self conscious of this mark, while others considered it a sign of great bravery and endurance. During the famine of 1853, Mary Ann died while Olive barely survived.

Word of a white Indian captive reached the Fort Yuma settlement about this time. A San Francisco newspaper picked up the story, and Lorenzo was convinced this was his sister, but all efforts to ransom her failed. Finally, in January 1856 a Yuma Indian named FRANCISCO offered to bargain for her release. Claiming there were great forces gathering to attack to reclaim their hostage, he secured her release. Olive began her journey back to her family by walking the 250 miles to Ft. Yuma arriving on the 22nd of February 1856. News of her release reached Lorenzo and the reunion at Ft. Yuma a month later became national news. The return to California was treated by some newspapers as a triumphal procession. All the publicity reached the Rogue Valley, and specifically Harvey B. OATMAN their cousin.

Harvey OATMAN had also emigrated west in 1853 with his wife Lucy, and his brother Harrison B. The brothers each took up a Donation Land Claim of about 320 acres near Phoenix, (now in Jackson county) Oregon Territory. By 1855, Harrison was supplying the miners in Northern California with the products of the valley. In September 1855, his supply train was attacked by Indians while crossing the Siskiyou mountains. He escaped by outrunning his pursuers six miles to Mountain House (see Barron P.O. v.37 no.3). This was the beginning of the Rogue River Indian war. Being thus involved with the Indian wars, the brothers only discovered the plight of their young cousins as their story became news. Harvey traveled to California and persuaded all concerned to let Olive and Lorenzo make their home with him.

While in Phoenix Lorenzo worked on Harvey's farm while Olive stayed with the Stephen P. TAYLOR family for a time. The Taylors were another of the original Land Claim settlers in the area. Here, she relearned English, learned to read and write, and was taught the customs and skills of white civilization with the help of Mrs. Abigail TAYLOR and her daughter Rachel, a teacher.

With the encouragement of their friends and relatives, Lorenzo and Olive decided to write a book, to correct inaccurate reporting and tell their version of the story. If the book did well it would finance their further education. For this effort they sought the help of Rev. Royal B. STRATTON. The first two editions sold over 11,000 copies and helped them attend the University of the Pacific in California for six months. They were now ready to leave the sanctuary they had found in Oregon, to return to their old home, and the numerous relatives left there. After the success of the last edition of their book, brother and sister went to live with their mother's sister and her family, Asa M. and Sarah ABBOTT in Ustick, Illinois.

DONATION LAND CLAIMS IN OREGON 1850-1855

Men came to California to seek the riches of gold, but families came to the Oregon Territory to claim the richness of the land. It was evident from the start of the westward migration, that a system for organizing and documenting the various claims was needed. In September 1850 the Donation Land Law was passed by the territorial government to give land to United States citizens, or those becoming citizens within a year. The law applied to white, or half-breed residents, and even women were eligible for an equal share. The original law provided 320 acres to a resident, and another 320 acres to the spouse. Those that arrived after the 1850 date and until 1855, would receive 160 acres each.

The Surveyor-General began to survey the public lands in October 1851. Because of the settlement pattern and the fact that the Indians were friendly in these areas, the Baseline was set just south of the Willamette River mouth and the Meridian down the Willamette Valley. Townships of six miles are numbered either north or south of the Baseline, and Ranges of six miles are numbered east or west of the Meridian. Each of the six square miles thus formed were divided into 36 sections. By knowing the Township, Range and Section(s), a location can be determined within 1 mile. Many claims incorporated parts of several sections, as the best land did not fall in neat squares. Settlers were required to occupy their land for four successive years, however the changes in 1853 allowed claimants to purchase their claims for \$1.25 an acre after two years. Claims were generally recorded in the nearest Land Claims office, in Roseburg for the area that became Jackson County in 1852. All but two records (noted by "OC" for Oregon City) in the list on the following pages, are from that office. These claimants are not listed in the Digger's general index.

For genealogists, one of the more important points of the Donation Land Law was the documentation required to secure a claim. The law required applicants to prove, through documents or affidavits: place of birth, or if foreign born -citizenship; date of arrival in Oregon; if married to whom, where and when; length of time residing on, and the cultivation of the land claimed. Because of the rough and dangerous life, many claims also include information on the claimant's widow or heirs. For example the claim of **John ROBINSON**, number 87, includes the information that he was born 1799 in Franklin, Co., PA; that he arrived in Oregon on the 30th of August 1853 and settled on a claim in Jackson County by the 1st of September the same year. The information also declares he married **Susan MILLIGIN** November 28, 1822 in Ross Co., OH and lists by name their eight children. Another, **William BERNEBURG**, claim number 117, was born December 1,1827/9 in Hesse, Kassel, Germany. He came to the US when he was about 18 years old in 1848, but his father had been naturalized in 1837 while William was a child. He married **Sarah Ann HATHAWAY** on February 1, 1853 in New London, Henry Co., IA. They arrived in Oregon August 12, 1853 and settled on a claim in Jackson Co. by June 1854.

This information, and information on other Oregon Land Claims can be found in the 5 vol. (plus index) set of Oregon Donation Land Claims in the RVGS library. Also in the library are microfiche of BLM Land Records for Jackson Co. (1850's) which show surveys of each Township and Range with the claims outlined; location of cabins and roads; terrain and soil type. The area now known as Phoenix was first settled by **Samuel COLVER**, who took a Donation land claim along the creek in the fall of 1851. By 1853 the area population had grown enough to lay out a town on the Colver land. Most of the land for the cemetery was donated by the Colvers.

The survey that continues in this issue, was compiled from the Phoenix Pioneer Cemetery Notebook by Myrna Bradley & Georgia Blankenship; Obituaries from the Mail Tribune 1953 to date at the RVGS Library; the Oregon Death Index; the Cemetery file as maintained by the RVGS, and on site surveys of the cemetery. Many stones are missing or illegible, but if there was a discrepancy, the information written in stone was used. The following names are not listed in the Digger's general index.

CIVILIAN CASUALTIES IN LAKE COUNTY OREGON DURING WWII

Having the dubious honor of being the only enemy inflicted deaths on the U.S. Mainland during WWII, were six people from Bly, Lake County, Oregon. Pastor Archie MITCHELL, and his wife Elyse MITCHELL, had taken a group of children from their church fishing on Gearhart Mountain, May 5, 1945. While the pastor parked the car, his wife and the children explored the area. They found an odd object in the bushes and called the Pastor over to see. Before he got there, an explosion rocked the area killing his wife and the five children. Elyse, Jay GIFFORD, Edward ENGEN, Dick and Joan PATZKE, and Sherman SHOEMAKER had found the remains of a Fu-Go balloon.

Six thousand of these hydrogen balloons, made from paper and carrying up to five bombs, were launched from Japan to follow the jet stream west and into the U.S. interior. As an "invisible attack" they were to create panic and start fires in the northwest timber stands. However, because most were launched during the winter months when the jet stream is most active, but also when the northwest is soggy with snow and rain, the few that reached the mainland were ineffective. The U.S. government was aware of these "windship weapons" but a policy of strict silence kept the Japanese from knowing the effect of the balloons. Because of the lack of news, the Japanese were convinced few Fu-Go's reached the mainland and the program was stopped in April, 1945. The Forest Service Park is now called the Mitchell Recreation Area, and a monument to the victims stands at the site of the explosion.

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

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

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JUDGE MILTON BERRY

Many of the following cases were held before **Judge Milton BERRY**, Ashland city recorder from 1889, and from 1890, Justice of the Peace. **Judge BERRY**, son of **James and Sarah** (**TAYLOR**) **BERRY**, was born January 13, 1837 in Cass County, IL. His father was from Virginia pioneer stock, and his mother from Kentucky. Graduating in 1861 from the Illinois College, he became a school principal in Illinois until he volunteered in 1862. Joining the 114th Illinois Volunteer Infantry, Company D, he took part in the siege of Vicksburg under the command of General Sherman. While on a raid outside Memphis in June of 1864, he was captured by Forrest's cavalry and taken to Andersonville prison. Six months later he was transferred and exchanged. Because of his poor condition, he remained in the Annapolis, MD. Hospital until the close of the war, being mustered out June 13, 1865. His name appears on the 1890 Census of pensioners in this issue. Returning to Cass County, IL., he taught school for many years until moving to Salem, Oregon in 1882. From there he taught in Albany and Gervais before arriving in Ashland, Jackson County, Oregon in 1884. He and his wife **Mary** (HANSFORD) BERRY had two children **Maude and Eugene C. BERRY. Judge BERRY** remained a Justice of the Peace in Ashland into his seventies, when he retired to Vallejo, CA.

DISPUTE OVER WATER RIGHT

For sometime past there has been going on quite a dispute over the right to use water for mining purposes from a ditch in the vicinity of Wimer, this county (Jacksonville). This trouble has been brewing for several months, but the kalidescope of tragic horrors was not focused until last Friday evening. In the vicinity of Wimer, and on Evan's Creek reside two ranchers whose names are BROWNSWORTH and SHERILL. BROWNSWORTH has been in the habit of using water from a creek which runs through SHERILL's property and which he (SHERILL) would at different times proceed to dam up in such a manner as to turn the water into another channel and away from the BROWNSWORTH's property, BROWNSWORTH would tear away the dam as many times as SHERILL would put it up. Last Friday the climax was climaxed when a 16 year old son of SHERILL's sallied forth with a gun intent upon doing bodily harm to young BROWNSWORTH, who was then engaged in opening up the dam. Dr. Geary was called and removed four shots from young BROWNSWORTH knee joint. He will undoubtedly loose the use of his knee, perhaps his limb and possibly his life. It is a bad, ugly wound and will require the closest attention lest complications set in which cannot easily be overcome. Young SHERILL was arrested and his trial came off Wednesday.

George BROWNSWORTH, the boy shot by Arthur SHERRILL, died last Saturday morning and was buried in the Rock Point Cemetery. The coroner, and Dr. GEARY, came from Medford Saturday evening, and attorney BENSON came from Grant's Pass, and an inquest was held. The verdict rendered was that the boy died from blood poison resulting from his wounds. The shot that lodged under the knee cap was not removed. It was decided to defer the trial until March 1st. The constable, F. PARKER, now has charge of the SHERILL boy.

ARRESTED FOR A MURDER COMMITTED TWENTY-FIVE YEARS AGO

On the 15th instant the grand jury found an indictment against **James HARDS** accusing him of the crime of murder in the first degree. The crime was committed in this county on the 27th May. 1868, nearly twenty-live years ago. At the time [the murderer] escaped and his whereabouts were not known until recently he returned and was residing on a ranch in the Cascade mountains, where he was arrested by **Sheriff PELTON**, and is now occupying one of the Pauley steel cells in our jail. The witness to the murder is now residing in this county.

FATAL SHOOTING NEAR JACKSONVILLE

James McGUIRE, a pioneer of Southern Oregon, was shot at his home at Blackwell Diggings last Monday evening about eight o'clock, by George CALDWELL. He was removed to the county hospital the following morning arriving there at ten a.m., and died an hour later. CALDWELL, is an 18 year old son of Chris CALDWELL, who is now serving a life sentence for killing a man in a dance house on the Siskiyou mountains when the tunnel was being made. Uncle Jimmy McGUIRE was a Mexican war veteran, and served with the volunteers through the Rogue River Indian wars. He enlisted in the first company of Oregon volunteers raised during the Civil War, under command of Col. R.F. MAURY, and was stationed at Camp Baker in this

county. There had been some feeling existing between Uncle Jimmy and some of his neighbors, and about two months ago he was tried in Justice DUNLAP's court on the charge of having shot at some boys. He was cleared of the charge and returned home and has been mining with George ROSS and Willie MURRAY since that time. Last week they cleaned up their work, and it is thought that the old man being again alone, the ill feeling was renewed with his neighbors, as he admitted in his ante mortem statement that he shot at one of the boys before receiving his death wound. Dr. PICKEL, county coroner, was summoned and an inquest was held lasting the entire day Wednesday. The verdict was that James McGUIRE came to his death by a gunshot wound inflicted by George CALDWELL, and that the shooting was unjustifiable and charging young CALDWELL with murder. The preliminary examination of CALDWELL was held before Justice DUNLAP Thursday. The funeral of James McGUIRE took place at Jacksonville Cemetery Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock. At a preliminary examination in the justice's court yesterday, young CALDWELL was committed without bail to answer the charges of murder.

MEDFORD MAIL

OUR TREASURE HAS GONE HENCE.

Excitement has been running high at the county seat this week. County Treasurer BLOOMER has absconded. It has been expected that he would "skip" when he realized that it would be impossible to make good his shortage. He is said to have made efforts in almost all directions to secure funds but to no avail. Saturday about noon he left Jacksonville for Ashland saying he was going there to get \$2,500 in order to be in readiness for the county commissioners' inspection on Tuesday. The last since seen of him was when he boarded the north-bound freight at Ashland Saturday night.

Following is taken from the proceeding of the county seat: In Session, August 8, 1893.

At this time comes on to be heard and determined the settlement of Geo. E. BLOOMER, Treasurer of Jackson County (Oregon), continued from July 15, 1893.

The said treasurer having failed to respond after being called at the door of the court house three times by the sheriff of Jackson County, and the court from an inspection of the records of this court finds that said treasurer is delinquent in the sum of \$15, 345.89.

Therefore, it is ordered that the district attorney, be and is hereby directed to forthwith begin an action in the name of the state of Oregon, on the official bond of said treasurer, to recover the amount of money which said treasurer is delinquent as such treasurer.

It is quite probable his deficit will not be more than half the above amount as it is reported there have been discovered in the treasury amounts aggregating something like \$7,300. If this be true the amount his bondsmen will be required to put up will be about \$8,000. His bondsmen are Chas. NICKEL and B. HAYMOND \$6,000 each, Jerry NUNAN \$4,500 and K. KUBLI \$2,500. The county court at their last session officially removed BLOOMER from the office of treasurer and appointed David LINN his successor, fixing his bonds at \$60,000.

The firm of Bloomer, Cronemiller & Co., of which treasurer **BLOOMER** was the senior partner, will suffer through his escapades. The agent of a Portland firm, to which they were indebted to the amount of \$1,200 arrived in Jacksonville yesterday morning and placed an attachment on the store goods. It is also reported that **Levi STRAUSS**, of San Francisco, a creditor to the amount of \$3,000 has been telegraphed and will probably arrive this evening. This demand, coming only a few weeks before their collections can be made from the farmers, will be a hardship to the firm, but it is probable they can square themselves without a very great loss.

A charge of forgery was booked last week against G.W. MATHEWS, a woman named BENTZ, who keeps a disreputable house, claiming that he had written a check on the Medford bank for \$3.50, signed it B. DOWELL, and given it to her as worth the amount stated. The check reached the bank and DOWELL repudiated it as a forgery. MATHEWS was arrested and his hearing was had before Justice BARRY last Saturday, Dist Attorney BENSON appearing for the state, and W.H. PARKER, of Jacksonville, and W.I. VAWTER, of Medford, for the defendant. The justice dismissed the charge. Whether guilty or innocent, the defendant has had a severe lesson, and one that ought to turn him out of the path that leads to the disgrace of himself and a respected family of Jackson county.

MURDER ON EVANS CREEK

Report reached Ashland Wednesday morning that **Stephen BEERS**, whose home is on a small ranch on Evans creek about 12 miles above Woodville, had killed his brother **John** [**BEERS**], and the report was confirmed later in the day, but only meager details of the tragedy have been received.

Stephen BEERS is a man of family and has lived in Evans creek for some time. John, who is unmarried, formerly lived with him, and had recently returned after a long absence. On Tuesday the two were at Grant's Pass, drinking together, and left that town in the afternoon both under the influence of liquor and each with a quart bottle full for further indulgence. When they reached home a drunken quarrel culminated in John being killed by Stephen. Stephen BEERS is under arrest, and his preliminary examination will take place before a justice of the peace at Woodville tomorrow.

GODFREY CAPTURED

Arrested Near Red Bluff - Now in Jail at Jacksonville - to be Tried Next Week

Thomas GODFREY, the young man who killed James SMITH near Siskiyou, this county, on
Sunday night. Sept. 24th last, is now in jail at Jacksonville, awaiting trial under indictment for
murder, and his trial will most likely occur during the present term of circuit court.

As stated in the TIDINGS last week, the grand jury found a true bill against GODFREY charging him with murder. GODFREY suspected that the matter would be laid before the grand jury, and had already left his cabin and started southward through California. Ex-sheriff B.W. DEAN was deputized to arrest him. [DEAN] soon found the trail of the fugitive, who was traveling on horseback and making his way southward as rapidly as possible - endeavoring to conceal his identity by some trifling attempts at personal disguise and by using an assumed name. At Red Bluff Sheriff Dean left the chase to Sheriff BOGGART, of Tehama county, [who] followed GODFREY without difficulty and arrested him about 25 miles southwest of Red Bluff. He wired report of the capture to Jacksonville and Monday morning officer DEAN took [the] train for Red Bluff, returning with his prisoner Tuesday. [Story of the shooting in detail]

The theory of the prosecution will be that GODFREY deliberately planned to kill Smith in order to escape paying him the two month's wages he owed him, and enticed him to the fatal place under the pretense of watching a deer lick, in order to make an opportunity for a murder which could be represented as an accident.

EARLY JACKSON COUNTY POST OFFICES

JACKSONVILLE

The development of Jacksonville began with the placer gold discoveries there in 1851-52. Some believe that Jacksonville was named for Jackson Creek, upon which it is situated and that Jackson Creek was named for one of the gold discoverers. However, current opinion is that the creek took its name from the county. Jacksonville post office was established on 18 Feb 1854 with R. DUGAN first postmaster.

He was editor of the first newspaper on the Pacific coast "The Spectator" in 1846; and the first newspaper in Southern Oregon "The Table Rock Sentinel." A U.S. Senator from Oregon, he was elected District Attorney in June 1868.

Mabella TURNER died 8 June 1880 @5y 6m 26d Hon. A.B. MEACHAM died in Washington DC 16 February 1882 of apoplexy. Maria SCHUMPF, wife of George, died 16 May 1882 in Jacksonville. A native of County Clare, Ireland she was 45 years old.

Eliza R. HOWARD died 6 February 1883 @ 10y 10m 9d in Jacksonville.

Addie LANGELL died 20 March 1883 in Jacksonville

Ernest WAGNER died 28 March 1883 @3y 8m 15d in Ashland

Elmina CHRISMAN died 18 November 1883 after a carriage accident caused her leg to be amputated. Born in Bedford County, Tennessee 17 September 1814, she moved to Oregon in 1852. On 18 June 1853 she married Walker CHRISMAN.

Mary B. MERRITT, wife of Prof. J.W. MERRITT, died 17 January 1884. She was born Mary B. McCULLY, one of the first children in Jacksonville.

Elizabeth R. NORVEL died at Evans Creek 16 October 1885 of consumption @29y 2m 16d. She was formerly Mrs. Upton WRISLEY.

William HOFFMAN, Esq. @84y 2m 7d. Born in Baltimore, Maryland 7 September 1801 of German descent, he married Caroline D. SHAFER on 22 September 1836. Hoping the climate would cure Caroline's asthma, they journeyed for six months across the plains to arrive in Southern Oregon in October 1853.

Ella L. NICKELL, wife of Charles and daughter of Mr. & Mrs. P.P. PRIM, died of heart failure after childbirth 8 June 1889 @ 31y 4m 5d. She was born in Jacksonville.

August VOLLMER died 29 May 1890 in Applegate.

Fannie PELLING, wife of John, died near Eagle Point of cancer, 11 June 1890 @57y 10m 24d.

John A. LOVE died 7 June 1890 of pulmonary disease @22y 4m 22d. Robert Delos MILLS died in Ashland 23 February 1897 @1y 4m 28d.

E.V. MILLS died 30 March 1897 in Ashland after a year struggle with tumors. Born in Lancaster County, Nebraska 8 September 1863, he married Ella BARCLAY on 30 November 1887 in Oakland, California.

Rev. Moses Allen WILLIAMS died near Medford 11 December 1897. Born in Washington County, Pennsylvania 26 September 1811, he arrived in the valley in 1857 and began the Presbyterian Church in Jacksonville. In July 1858 he married Amelia JACKS who died 23 October 1873. In 1884 he married Mrs. Sarah L. VAN DYKE.

Mrs. W.J. PLYMALE died 16 June 1899 of cancer. She was born in Platte County, Missouri 3 June 1845 and brought by her parents to Oregon in 1846. Her father was Col. W.J. MARTIN. She married W.J. PLYMALE in 1863.

Mrs. Jane McCULLY died 22 June 1899 @75y 2m 22d. A native of Scotland, she was a resident of Jacksonville since 1852.

Prudence M. WALKER died in Medford 7 June 1901. Born in West Virginia 11 June 1812, she crossed the plains to the Willamette Valley in 1845. Moving on to Southern Oregon in 1852, she first married Mr. RICE. In1868, near Phoenix, she married Enoch WALKER, who died September 1900.

Patrick DUNN @77y 4m 5d. Born 24 March 1824 in Wexford, Linster, Ireland of Patrick & Johanna (Toole) DUNN, he came with his family to America in the 1830's. Patrick moved to Jacksonville in 1852 where he married Mary M. HILL, daughter of Isaac HILL, 24 February 1854.

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

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

DIED AT THE PENITENTIARY

The messenger of death visited the penitentiary yesterday about 1:30 o'clock, and took the spirit of Geo. J. CALDWELL back to God, who gave it. He was yet a lad 19 years of age, and a life prisoner, for the crime of manslaughter, committed from Jackson County, about two months ago. His story is a sad one, and stands as an example to young men of the fallacy of sowing seed amidst the tares where the tiller tilleth not. Twelve years ago his Christian mother left him for that unknown beyond, to shape his own career and battle with the controversies of life. Five years after the mother's death the father was sentenced to the state prison for murder in the second degree, to remain for his natural life, and he is now a trusty, and is highly spoken of by the officers of that institution. After the boy's arrival he went to work with a will, and showed a disposition that was not bad. About three weeks ago he was stricken with typhoid fever from which he died Sunday. The funeral will be a public one and will be conducted by Rev. SHULSE, on Tuesday morning at 10 o'clock. The remains will be interred in the burying ground set apart for that institution, just east of the prison. This is the first public funeral that has ever been held from the penitentiary for a prisoner. (From the Salem [OR] Independent, Feb 19, 1894)

MONDAY, DECEMBER 10, 1894

In the case of the county judge J.R. NEIL, indicted by the grand jury for "defacing a building not his own," in breaking into the county jail and removing an insane prisoner confined therein, the defendant was arraigned on Friday morning and entered a plea of "not guilty." The prosecution was conducted by District Attorney BENSON and W.M. COLVIG, Francis FITCH appearing for the defense. A jury was impaneled to try the case and at noon on Saturday it was given to them. The jury deliberated for 10 hours before a verdict of guilty was reached.

ASHLAND TIDINGS

The grand jury last week returned an indictment against one **D.R. DAVIS**, charging him with the crime of bigamy. **Deputy Sheriff BARNES** arrested **DAVIS** at the Snowgoose mine in the Siskiyous, near Steinman, and took him before **Judge HANNA** for arraignment. The defendant plead guilty to the charge and was remanded to jail, where he is still awaiting sentence. (Note: Listed as **DAVIES** in the docket book.)

DAVIS married **Addie HALL** in Yamhill County, this state, in May 1882. They lived together until two or three years ago when trouble arose between them and she left him, with the intention of securing a divorce. The divorce was never secured, it seems, though **DAVIS** says he supposed it had been granted and that he was free to marry **Lucinda WILSON**, whom he wooed and won last spring near Medford, and whom he married on the 8th of April last.

The motion for a new trial and stay of judgment in the embezzlement case against W.E. HOWE, ex-treasurer of Klamath County, after the rendering of a jury verdict of guilty last Friday evening, was argued before **Judge HANNA** on Monday afternoon and on Tuesday morning was overruled and the defendant sentenced to nine year's imprisonment in the state penitentiary and to pay a fine of \$16,000, double the amount of the embezzlement. The attorneys for the defense immediately filed a notice of appeal to the supreme court.

Scarcely six months ago William E. HOWE was one of the prominent citizens of

Klamath Falls, respected, esteemed and trusted by all. Twice he had been elected treasurer of the county and before his election had served as deputy for his predecessor. The best citizens of the county were his bondsmen and had not hesitated to assume the responsibility of insuring the safety of the county funds in HOWE's custody. Socially, none in the town stood higher and it was not until the time came for him to turn over his office and the county funds on hand to his successor, Alex. MARTIN, Jr., the first of last July, that the storm broke and revealed a story of ingratitude and dishonesty to his friends and to the world.

On the day he was ordered to make his settlement with the new treasurer a fire occurred in Klamath Falls and destroyed the building in which his office was located, and, he claims. burned up \$8,000 in currency, comprising the county funds on hand which he had removed from the court house safe and taken to his office at his private place of business preparatory to making a settlement with Mr. MARTIN. He claimed to have placed the money in a store room in the rear end of the store building for safe keeping while he was away for a short time during which the fire occurred. An examination of his books showed then to be far from a condition to make a settlement and his story as to the loss of the county funds in the fire was doubted. He was arrested and kept in jail at Klamath Falls on five charges of violating the law requiring the advertising of warrants when there was \$1500 in money on hand. The grand jury ignored the charges on which he was arrested but indicted him on two charges of embezzlement - one for \$52 and the other for \$8,000. He was acquitted on the first trial by instructions from the judge. On the second charge a change of venue was granted to Jackson County. The case has been hotly contested throughout. The defendant has been represented by Attorneys J.W. HAMAKER and F.A. COGGSWELL, while Col. N.B. KNIGHT has assisted District Attorney BENSON in the prosecution of the case. Forty witnesses were examined in the last trial of HOWE and the cost to Klamath County will be somewhere between \$1500 and \$2000. The county had expended already almost as much as that in trying cases against HOWE in the Klamath courts.

DAVIS, HE FLEW

Junction City, Dec. 18 - This morning when the north bound over-land stopped here it had aboard **Sheriff PATTERSON**, of Jacksonville County, and a deputy and a prisoner, all bound for Salem. When it left the sheriff and deputy were aboard, but the prisoner wasn't. The story of the escape is rather amusing and reads in this way:

Just before reaching this point the prisoner, whose name we are unable to learn, but who is probably **D.R. DAVIS**, convicted of polygamy in the Jackson County circuit court and sentenced to two years in the pen, went into the water closet on the car. He crawled through the window and got away when this point was reached. The officers went to look for him when the train was leaving Harrisburg and found he was missing, but as the train had started, were unable to get off until they reached Halsey. [The officers] started back immediately, reached Junction about 10 o'clock this morning and at once began hunting for he, who was to be the guest of the state. At last accounts their search had awarded them nothing. **Constable McCLURE** of Junction is assisting them in the search. (Note: Listed as **DAVIES** in the docket book.)

Charged with, and found guilty of "defacing a building not his own," in December of 1894, because he broke into the county jail, James R. NEIL was actually one of the most respected judges and successful lawyers in Jackson county.

James came with his family by wagon from Tennessee, arriving near Ashland in 1854, when he was thirteen. His father, Clayborne, took up a land claim southeast of town, on the creek that came to bear the NEIL name. Because of the Indian unrest at the time, James' mother, Louisa (Gibson) NEIL, and his youngest siblings moved to Yreka, California. James, as the eldest, and his father stayed on the ranch. At the end of the hostilities, with seven sons and five daughters, the NEIL homestead became one of the most productive in the valley.

Because of the move west, and the fear of Indian attacks, James found his early education erratic. He continued at the Ashland Academy, and after a time as a volunteer in the Modoc War, graduated from Willamette University. In 1865, at the age of 24, James was admitted to the bar. Also that year, he married Amanda "Minnie" HELM, then moved to Jacksonville to set up his home and new law practice. Without the threat of Indian attacks, neighbors turned to attacking each other with lawsuits, and his law practice thrived. Because of his skill and reputation, James R. NEIL was elected District Attorney in 1876, re-elected in 1878, and again in 1880. Riding around the district, which included Jackson, Lake, Josephine, and Klamath counties, to attend cases must have been demanding. His travels became more manageable when he was elected Jackson County Judge in 1888 and 1892, beginning his third term in 1908. Sadly, the beginning of 1908 found him suffering the loss of his wife Minnie, who died January 16th of that year, at age 63, after a long illness.

For the next ten years Judge NEIL lived alone, despite suffering from various heart problems. On December 10, 1917 he evidently felt poorer than usual, and visited his doctor. He returned home to rest, having the fire built up to keep off the chill he was feeling. Late that night a neighbor, Chauncey FLOREY, noticed the house in flames and rushed to help, but it was clearly too late. Judge NEIL perished in the fire either from a heart attack upon discovering the blaze, or from the fire itself. The funeral was held in the Masonic Temple, and Judge James R. NEIL was buried in the Jacksonville Cemetery.

From The Journal of **E.R.PETERSON**, Rural School Supervisor, Jackson County Schools, 1917:

"A stereopticon has been used in various parts of the county during the past two years. Some very practical lectures have been given in many places, and have been well received in most cases. "A fertile soil means a prosperous people," "Weeds mean waste," "Trap the fly" are among those used.

State traveling libraries were used to some extent when the writer [PETERSON] began his work in the county, but their distribution has been greatly widened during the past four years. The work has been supplemented by recommending certain books to individuals and having them included in the shipment from the Library. This institution is an important factor in the educational uplift of the state.

Another phase of the work in connection with the State Library was the borrowing of books by the supervisor for re-lending. Usually from 30 to 60 books were had out at a time. When going into any particular part of the county, from one to twenty books were taken along. A copy would be left where some good might result, usually a few words being said to arouse interest. The reader was asked to pass it around his friends until the supervisor called again.

A collection of small books of special merit was used under the "Pass-Me-On" system. So far as the writer is aware, the plan is entirely new. Little books in this way were given a very wide circulation. A few were lost, but they were inexpensive. The plan in general was very successful."

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
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ROGUE VALLEY GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY

The newsletter will not be mailed to organizations unless requested.

PIONEER AND EARLY SETTLER CERTIFICATES

Rogue Valley Pioneer and Early Settler Certificates are offered to direct descendants as a way to honor early pioneers. Completed application and documentation will be maintained in the Pioneer Family File at the RVGS Library after verification. To be eligible for a Rogue Valley Pioneer Certificate, applicant must descend directly from an ancestor who settled in the Rogue Valley prior to 1865 or for an Early Settler Certificate before January 1, 1900.

PIONEER REUNION JACKSONVILLE, OREGON 1898

The Oregon pioneers were an adventuresome and hardy group, proud of what they had overcome and accomplished. Realizing however, that many were getting older, and that this history should not be lost, James SUTTON, founder of the Ashland Tidings newspaper, published an editorial wishing for the organization of a society to preserve the stories of the pioneers of Southern Oregon. He called for a gathering in Jacksonville of all those interested on November 18, 1876. At this organizational meeting, Col. John E. ROSS was called to chair, William HOFFMAN appointed Secretary, and U.S. HAYDEN as Treasurer. Capt. Thomas SMITH moved that each member furnish the secretary with a short biography including name, place of birth, place and state they emigrated from, and date of arrival in Oregon. A committee was appointed to draft a constitution. The constitution was approved December 2, 1876 and included articles defining the object of collecting information on the settlement of Southern Oregon, the membership being open to all those arriving in Oregon prior to the end of 1855, and the name as "Society of Pioneers of Southern Oregon." The annual member assessment was not to exceed \$1.

The first annual meeting was held in Jacksonville June 7, 1877. The officers elected then were **L.J.C. DUNCAN**, President; **Capt. Thomas SMITH**, Vice president; **Wm. HOFMAN**, Secretary; and **U.S. HAYDEN**, Treasurer. It was decided to create a badge of fringed buckskin, 1" wide and 6" long, with the initials S.P.S.O. imprinted. An annual picnic and reunion was planned for the 2nd Thursday in September. Both these were suggestions of **Col. ROSS**.

The first reunion was held in Ashland September 13, 1877 with at least 800 pioneers attending, some from Josephine and Lake counties as well. The names mentioned in the newspaper report of the event (Ashland Tidings Sept. 28, 1877 & excerpts Sept. 12, 1895) included the officers of the organization, the musical director Prof. J.H. SKIDMORE, the Rev. M.A. WILLIAMS, and the orator Gen. E.L. APPLEGATE. After the picnic and speakers closed the day, a grand ball was held that evening in Patterson's Hall.

The date of arrival in Oregon for membership advanced through the years, and the name seemed to vary, but the annual reunion continued. So did the gathering by the society of information on, and recollections of, these early pioneers. The "Record Book of Proceedings of the Pioneer Society of Southern Oregon", held by the Southern Oregon Historical Society, contains those short biographies submitted by the members, and carefully recorded by the secretaries, since 1877. Some members, unfortunately, were not very forthcoming. The society also reported at each reunion the loss of members during the past year. These reports were generally carried by the Ashland Tidings. Because of the very nature of the organization, the membership dwindled until it was no longer viable. Sometime after 1965 the Society of Pioneers of Southern Oregon ceased to exist and the records and documents were handed over to the Southern Oregon Historical Society.

Here, and in future Diggers, are transcribed the biographical information recorded in their "Record Book."

ROGUE VALLEY GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY LIBRARY

Did one of your grandparents travel the Oregon Trail? Or is there a family story of a Cherokee grandmother, but you have been unable to find her? Perhaps the answers you've been looking for can be found at the Rogue Valley Genealogical Society Library.

The Society's 13,000 volume collection includes books, microfilm & microfiche, videos, & cd-roms. The references cover all parts of the country, as well as many parts of the world, with census, immigration, church and cemetery records, newspaper abstracts, diaries and family histories. The library also receives more than 75 bulletins from other genealogical societies. There is a wealth of information to be found from known sources, many of them original documents and record books.

Internet genealogy has attracted many because it is fast and easy, but much of the information on the internet is from questionable, or unknown sources. It is a good place to start, but doing your own research, checking those names, dates and sources, will give you more confidence in your data. In your internet inspired family tree how many children were born before their mothers were 10 years old? Or died at 105?

Our Librarian, Emillee Brazill, and the volunteer staff, are knowledgeable and anxious to help locate that elusive ancestor, or suggest a way through that "brick wall" blocking your way. Many of the resources in the library are instructional and can offer ways to proceed, or keep data under control and safe.

The Oregon collection, especially covering Southern Oregon, is one of the best in the country. So, if your grandparents passed this way in a covered wagon, their tracks are likely to be found in our library. A vertical file contains almost 200 pioneer family histories and individual biographies. Get a feeling for their journey by reading one of several diaries kept by those crossing the plains to find a better life. For an insight into the early life in the Rogue Valley, check the newspaper abstracts. They are full of vital statistics and human interest stories.

From the Journal of E.R. PETERSON
Rural School Supervisor, Jackson County, Oregon Schools
1917

"An effort has been made to have play apparatus placed in every school. Much good has resulted. But in too many cases the apparatus has been of a temporary nature. Active boys and girls wear out the things they play with; swing ropes break and are not repiaced; balls wear out, seesaw foundations give way. It has not yet been generally accepted by boards and patrons that play apparatus should be a regular part of the school equipment, that the budget each year should contain for this purpose an allowance in proportion to the needs and means of the district.

Provision for drinking water and facilities for washing also are much neglected features. Individual cups have been recommended during the past few years. In most cases they were obtained; but they are not satisfactory because they are not properly kept. A fountain with running water seems to be the only system that gives entire satisfaction. A fountain pump is on the market that seems to be working well. The writer [E.R. Peterson] has not seen it in operation.

Many changes that have taken place during the past years have come about gradually. Often it is difficult to know just when or just how certain changes or improvements were made. Much of the work of the supervisor has been of a personal nature among the boys, with some very good results, it is believed."

DEATH OF MR. J.W. PLYMIRE

Mr. J.W. PLYMIRE, an old resident of this part of Jackson county, died at his farm house, three miles northeast of Medford, on Monday of this week. Funeral services were held the following day, conducted by the members of the A.O.U.W. lodge, of this city, to which he belonged. Some twenty odd members were in attendance. Mr. PLYMIRE had been ill but two weeks prior to his death and was only confined to his bed five days. His malady was Bright's disease. Deceased came to Jackson county in 1870 and located upon the land upon which he died last Monday. He was born in Missouri in 1839. In 1866, or soon after the close of the war, he moved to Nevada where he remained until 1870, when he came to Oregon, as above stated. He leaves a wife and four children to mourn his sudden demise. Of the children there are two sons and two daughters, the oldest, Lilah, being fourteen years of age, the three youngest being Jesse, Carrie and Clyde.

AN INQUEST WAS HELD

The remains of J.W. PLYMIRE were disinterred for Examination.

In noting the death and burial of **J.W.PLYMIRE** in last week's MAIL we little thought that before another issue of our paper an inquest would have been held over the remains.

A few days after the funeral of Mr. PLYMIRE, which occurred on Tuesday of last week, a report was circulated - by whom started we are unable to state - suffice it to say that it was started, that there might have been foul play connected with his death, and as soon as this report became generally current, those immediately interested demanded an investigation.

On Sunday morning Coroner BROWER and District Attorney BENSON came to this city and ordered the body exhumed and an autopsy held. The remains were brought to I.A. WEBB's undertaking parlors about noon Sunday, and at 1 o'clock a jury was impaneled and the inquest began. The jury was composed of L.G.PORTER, N.B. BRADBURY, J.R. WILSON, J.W. REDDEN, W.F. SHAWVER, and W.K. DAVIS; J.R. WILSON was chosen as foreman. The following witnesses were examined by Attorney Benson: Drs. JONES and COLE, Mrs. Louise PLYMIRE, wife of the deceased, Chas. WILKINSON, Mrs. H.C. NUTE, Mrs. A. GARRETT, Mrs. S.E. GARRETT and Mrs. M.A. CASTILL. The testimony of all the witnesses tended to show that everything was done for the man's comfort and that the attending physicians did all in their power to save his life, the cause of death given in by them being Bright's disease of the kidneys.

While the inquest was being conducted in the city hall an autopsy was being performed by **Dr. E.B. PICKEL**. The brain was first removed and was found in a very healthy condition, and weighed 50 ounces. The other organs which are needed in an investigation of this nature,

were removed by the doctor, and all found in a normal condition with the exception of the kidneys, which were found in a completely degenerated state. These parts of the human anatomy should weigh about five ounces, or as the physician stated, anywhere from four to six ounces each, but those removed greatly exceeded that weight, the right one weighing 30 ounces and the left one 34 ounces. To one familiar with these organs it is no surprise that Mr. PLYMIRE's death was sudden - in fact the surprise would be that he survived as long as he did.

The autopsy demonstrated clearly that there are undoubtedly many sudden deaths which are not caused by the administration of poison or by other foul means, and when reports of this nature gain circulation they should be stopped at once, as this one was, by a thorough examination. If the cause of death is found to be as stated by the attending physician and nothing of a suspicious nature discovered, then relatives and friends, over whom there has been thrown a shadow of suspicion, are at once relieved of a burden, which under other circumstances they must - though perfectly innocent - carry with them through life. Persons who circulate stories which must in the end throw suspicion upon innocent persons should first consider well what they are saying. They should think well of the humiliation they may cause. On the other hand, if there is the least shadow of existing evidence of crime then they should be just as considerate and just as active to bring justice the parties who would take this means by which to take away a human life, and should do so by being instrumental in causing a speedy and thorough examination.

ASHLAND TIDINGS

The Grand Jury yesterday returned an indictment against City Marshall SMITH of Ashland upon a charge of assault and battery preferred by Jasper LOMAS. The charge grew out of the arrest on the street, Aug. 15th, of Mr. LOMAS by the Marshall, on the charge of disturbing the peace. LOMAS claims that he was struck brutally and unnecessarily at the time.

A COWARDLY SHOT IN THE BACK

Frank WADE, a young ex-convict, shoots and mortally wounds Francis MARLOW, Lake Creek, this county, the scene of the cold blooded crime.

Frank WADE, aged about 24 years, shot and mortally wounded Frank MARLOW, aged 21, last Thursday, shortly before noon, on Herman MYERS' place, in Chimney Rock precinct, about 20 miles north of Ashland, in the Butte Creek section. WADE used a 44 Winchester rifle and the bullet struck MARLOW in the back, and he died from the wound the following morning. The murderer is in custody.

Coroner **D.M. BROWER** was summoned from Ashland and held an inquest Saturday, **A.N. SOLISS** of Jacksonville officiating as deputy district attorney. The jury, after hearing testimony, returned a verdict charging **WADE** with deliberate and premeditated murder.

(The Tidings followed this story with all the testimony, the Ante Mortem Statement, and the verdict of the jury.)

Frank WADE, who shot and killed Frank MARLOW at Lake Creek last Thursday, was brought to Jacksonville Saturday at 4 a.m., and lodged in jail. The prisoner has served a term in the penitentiary for horse stealing and his recent crime is another evidence of the unwisdom of PENNOYER's wholesale pardoning scheme, which, in many instances has only meant a larger license for the commission of a crime.

Lawrence WADE, aged 18, was arrested Friday by Constable WOOLF of Medford as an accessory before the fact, and according to the Oregon statues which makes no distinction between an accessory and a principal, was charged with his brother, with the crime.

THE WADE BOYS PLEAD GUILTY

Jackson county is saved an expensive murder trial in the quick disposal of the case against Frank WADE, principal, and his brother, Lawrence WADE, accessory, for the murder of Frank MARLOW, in the Lake Creek country, the third of last October.

The grand jury, on Friday, returned a true bill against Frank and Lawrence WADE for the murder of Frank MARLOW on the 3rd of October 1895.

The accused were arraigned and given until Saturday to plead. When brought into court they pleaded not guilty. The accused withdrew their pleas of not guilty, and Frank entered a plea of guilty to murder in the second degree and Lawrence of manslaughter. The court thereupon sentenced Frank to the penitentiary for life and Lawrence for fifteen years.
